Creates fourth degree crime of operating drone equipped with weapon.

1	AN ACT concerning unmanned aircraft systems and supplementing
2	Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes.

4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:

7	1. a. As used in this section:
8	"Anti-personnel device" means a firearm as defined in N.J.S.2C:39-
9	1, any prohibited weapon or device under N.J.S.2C:39-3, or any other
10	projectile designed to harm, incapacitate, or otherwise negatively
11	impact a human being.
12	"Civilian unmanned aircraft system" means an unmanned aircraft
13	and associated elements, including communication links and the
14	components that control the unmanned aircraft that are required for the
15	pilot in command to operate safely and efficiently. The term shall apply
16	only to unmanned aircraft and associated elements owned or operated
17	by a private individual or business entity.
18	"Operate" shall have the same meaning as defined in section 1 of
19	P.L.2017, c.315 (C.2C:40-27).
20	"Unmanned aircraft" shall have the same meaning as defined in
21	section 1 of P.L.2017, c.315 (C.2C:40-27).
22	b. A person who operates a civilian unmanned aircraft system that
23	is equipped with an anti-personnel device shall be guilty of a crime of
24	the fourth degree.

26	2. This act shall take effect immediately.

29	STATEMENT
30	
31	This bill makes it a fourth degree crime to operate a drone that is
32	equipped with a weapon.
33	Specifically, under the provisions of this bill, a person who
34	operates a civilian unmanned aerial vehicle, commonly referred to as
35	a drone, that is equipped with an anti-personnel device is guilty of a
36	fourth degree crime.
37	A fourth degree crime is punishable by up to 18 months
38	imprisonment, a fine of up to \$10,000, or both.
39	The bill defines "civilian unmanned aerial vehicle" as an aerial
40	vehicle owned or operated by a private individual or business entity
41	that uses aerodynamic forces to propel the vehicle and does not carry
42	a human operator, and which is capable of flying autonomously or
43	being piloted remotely and conducting surveillance.
