## P.L. 2021, CHAPTER 483, *approved January 18, 2022* Assembly, No. 6159

1 AN ACT concerning the Office of the Food Insecurity Advocate and 2 amending P.L.2021, c.242. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 1 of P.L.2021, c.242 (C.52:27J-1) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 The Legislature finds and declares that: 1. 10 (a) Over one million people are estimated to be food insecure in New Jersey and more than one-third of them are children; 11 (b) The coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic is projected to cause 12 13 a disproportionate increase in the rate of food insecurity in this 14 State compared to the national rate and neighboring states; 15 (c) Several departments are responsible for administering 16 different food insecurity programs in the State: the Department of 17 Human Services administers the New Jersey Supplemental 18 Nutrition Assistance Program; the Department of Health administers the New Jersey Supplemental Nutrition Program for 19 Women Infants and Children; and the Department of Agriculture 20 21 administers the United States Department of Agriculture's school 22 nutrition program in New Jersey; 23 (d) The State's food insecurity programs are currently operating in silos and, in some cases, they may all cover the same families, 24 yet not all eligible families are enrolled into each program; and 25 26 (e) Establishing an Office of the Food [Insecurity] Security 27 Advocate by statute will help coordinate the administration of the 28 State's food insecurity programs, advocate for the food insecure, 29 and develop new policy initiatives to combat hunger and facilitate 30 greater access to food relief programs. (cf: P.L.2021, c.242, s.1) 31

1 2. Section 3 of P.L.2021, c.242 (C.52:27J-3) is amended to 2 read as follows: 3 There is created in the Executive Branch of the State 3. 4 Government the Office of the Food [Insecurity] Security Advocate. 5 For the purpose of complying with the provisions of Article V, 6 Section IV, paragraph 1 of the New Jersey Constitution, the Office 7 of the Food [Insecurity] Security Advocate is allocated to the 8 [Economic Development Authority in the] Department of [the 9 Treasury] Agriculture, but notwithstanding this allocation, the 10 office shall be independent of any supervision or control by the [Economic Development Authority or by the] department, or by 11 12 any board or officer thereof, in the performance of its duties. The 13 office shall have the duty to collaborate with the appropriate State 14 agency to: 15 (a) coordinate outreach for food insecurity programs, including developing new initiatives and outreach campaigns and identifying 16 17 best practices to increase enrollment in the State's food insecurity 18 programs; 19 (b) establish a 24-hour toll-free hunger hotline to assist in 20 making information about the State's food insecurity programs as 21 widely available as possible; 22 (c) support grant application processes related to food insecurity 23 for in-state providers and State departments by monitoring available 24 grants, recommending grant applications, and assisting with the 25 grant application process; 26 (d) coordinate communication with and between food banks; 27 (e) establish best practices for food banks to reduce food waste 28 and to distribute more fresh produce and proteins to food insecurity 29 programs and food banks; 30 (f) cooperate with research organizations and universities to 31 monitor ongoing gap analysis that identifies areas that are 32 undeserved by current food insecurity programs; 33 (g) work with State and community partners to develop a 34 strategic plan to address identified gaps in areas that are undeserved 35 by current food insecurity programs; 36 (h) oversee the development and implementation of public-37 private partnerships to address food insecurity; 38 (i) provide support in coordinating assistance to address food 39 insecurity during federal or State declared states of emergency; 40 (j) coordinate food insecurity programming and initiatives for institutions of higher education with the Office of the Secretary of 41 42 Higher Education; 43 (k) develop new initiatives, establish an outreach campaign, and 44 identify best practices to reach senior citizens, persons with 45 disabilities, and other vulnerable population; and 46 (1) coordinate outreach efforts for the newly unemployed who 47 might be eligible for food insecurity programs. 48 (cf: P.L.2021, c.242, s.3)

1 3. Section 4 of P.L.2021, c.242 (C.52:27J-4) is amended to 2 read as follows: 3 4. The administrator and chief executive officer of the office is 4 the food [insecurity] security advocate, who shall be a person 5 qualified by training and experience to perform the duties of the 6 office. The food [insecurity] security advocate shall be appointed 7 by the Governor and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor 8 during the Governor's term of office and until the appointment and 9 qualification of the food [insecurity] security advocate's successor. 10 The food [insecurity] security advocate shall devote time entirely 11 to the duties of the position and shall receive a salary as determined 12 Any vacancy occurring in the position of the food by law. [insecurity] <u>security</u> advocate shall be filled in the same manner as 13 14 the original appointment; except that if the food [insecurity] security advocate dies, resigns, becomes ineligible to serve for any 15 16 reason, or is removed from office, the Governor shall appoint an 17 acting food [insecurity] security advocate, who shall serve until the 18 appointment and qualification of the food [insecurity] security 19 advocate's successor, but in no event longer than six months from 20 the occurrence of the vacancy, and who shall exercise during this 21 period all the powers and duties of the food [insecurity] security 22 advocate pursuant to the provisions of this act. 23 (cf: P.L.2021, c.242, s.4)

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24 25 4. Section 5 of P.L.2021, c.242 (C.52:27J-5) is amended to

read as follows:

5. The food [insecurity] security advocate, as administrator
and chief executive officer of the office, shall:

administer and organize the work of the office and establish 29 a. 30 therein such administrative subdivisions as the food [insecurity] 31 security advocate may deem necessary, proper and expedient. The 32 food [insecurity] security advocate may formulate and adopt rules 33 and regulations and prescribe duties for the efficient conduct of the 34 business, work and general administration of the office. The food 35 [insecurity] security advocate may delegate to subordinate officers 36 or employees in the office such power as the food [insecurity] security advocate may deem desirable to be exercised under the 37 food [insecurity] security advocate's supervision and control; 38

39 b. appoint and remove stenographic, clerical, and other 40 secretarial assistants as may be required for the proper conduct of 41 the office, subject to the provisions of Title 11A of the New Jersey 42 Statutes, and other applicable statutes, and within the limits of 43 funds appropriated or otherwise made available therefor. In 44 addition, and within funding limits, the food [insecurity] security 45 advocate may appoint, retain, or employ, without regard to the 46 provisions of Title 11A of the New Jersey Statutes or any other 47 statutes, any officers, financial managers, social workers, or other

1 professionally qualified personnel on a contract basis or otherwise 2 as the food [insecurity] security advocate deems necessary; 3 c. maintain suitable headquarters for the office and such other 4 quarters as the food [insecurity] security advocate shall deem 5 necessary to the proper functioning of the office; d. solicit and accept grants of funds from the federal 6 7 government and from other public and any private sources for any 8 of the purposes of this act; provided, however, that any such funds 9 shall be expended only pursuant to an appropriation made by law; 10 serve as the liaison between the Office of the Food e. [Insecurity] <u>Security</u> Advocate and the Departments of Agriculture, 11 Education, Health, and Human Services; and 12 13 perform such other functions as may be prescribed in this act f. 14 or by any other law. (cf: P.L.2021, c.242, s.5) 15 16 17 5. Section 6 of P.L.2021, c.242 (C.52:27J-6) is amended to 18 read as follows: 19 6. Pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), the food [insecurity] security advocate 20 and the Commissioners of Agriculture, Education, Health, and 21 22 Human Services may adopt any rules and regulations necessary to 23 effectuate the purposes of this act. 24 (cf: P.L.2021, c.242, s.6) 25 26 6. This act shall take effect immediately. 27 28 29 **STATEMENT** 30 31 This bill renames the Office of the Food Insecurity Advocate and 32 the position of the food insecurity advocate as the Office of the 33 Food Security and food security advocate, respectively. The bill 34 also provides that the office will be allocated to the Department of 35 Agriculture, instead of the Economic Development Authority in the Department of the Treasury. 36 37 38 39 40 41 Revises and renames Office of Food Insecurity Advocate.
