SYNOPSIS

Adds 9-1-1 system regionalization costs to funds appropriated from "9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Trust Fund Account."

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

1 **AN ACT** concerning 9-1-1 system regionalization and amending P.L.2004, c.48.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 3 of P.L.2004, c.48 (C.52:17C-19) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. a. There is established in the Department of the Treasury within the General Fund a special account to be known as the "9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Trust Fund Account."
- 12 b. Funds credited to the "9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Trust Fund Account" shall be annually appropriated for 13 14 the purposes of paying: (1) eligible costs pursuant to the provisions 15 of sections 13 and 14 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-13 and 52:17C-14); (2) the costs of funding the State's capital equipment (including 16 17 debt service), facilities and operating expenses that arise from 18 emergency response; (3) the cost of emergency response training, 19 including any related costs or expenses of the Office of Emergency Management in the Division of State Police in the Department of 20 Law and Public Safety; (4) the cost of operating the Office of 21 22 Emergency Telecommunications Services created pursuant to 23 section 3 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-3); (5) the cost of operating 24 the Statewide Public Safety Communications Commission created pursuant to section 5 of P.L.2011, c.4 (C.52:17C-3.2); (6) any costs 25 26 associated with implementing any requirement of the Federal 27 Communications Commission concerning 9-1-1 service that is not 28 otherwise allocated to a [carrier] telephone company and not 29 eligible for reimbursement under law or regulation; (7) any costs 30 associated with planning, designing, or implementing an automatic 31 location identification technology that is not otherwise allocated to 32 a wireless [carrier] telephone company and not eligible for 33 reimbursement under law or regulation; [and] (8) any costs 34 associated with planning, designing, or acquiring replacement 35 equipment or systems (including debt service) related to the 36 enhanced 9-1-1 network as defined by subsection e. of section 1 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-1); and (9) any costs associated with the 37 regionalization of the State's 9-1-1 system, including the expansion 38 39 of existing regional public safety answering points, as authorized in 40 section 7 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-7).
