SYNOPSIS

Provides police officers may be present at senior residential center or school being used as polling place under certain circumstances; requires school to establish election day security plan.

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AN ACT providing that police officers may be present at a senior
residential center ¹or public school¹ being used as a polling place
under certain circumstances ¹[and], requiring public schools to
establish election day security plans,¹ amending R.S.19:6-16¹,
and supplementing chapter 8 of Title 19 of the Revised Statutes¹.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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10 1. R.S.19:6-16 is amended to read as follows:

11 19:6-16. a. The commission, committee, board or official 12 having charge of the police department in any county or 13 municipality shall not assign police officers to any district board in that county or municipality, in order to enforce the election laws, 14 15 maintain order, peace and quiet during the hours of registry and 16 election, assist the board by performing the duties of a board 17 member, or serve at the polling place of that district board, or in 18 order to perform other routine purposes related to the conduct of elections, except that a district board, superintendent of elections, or 19 20 a county clerk may request that a police officer or sheriff's officer 21 be assigned to transport specific election materials to a polling 22 place or from a polling place to the district board or county clerk 23 and a police officer or sheriff's officer may be assigned for that 24 purpose. The commission, committee, board or official having 25 charge of the police department in any county or municipality may 26 assign one or more police officers to a senior residential center 27 [that has reported a threat or safety concern] ¹or school¹ at the request of the center 1 or school 1 , and any such officer assigned to a 28 29 senior residential center shall be in plain clothes and shall not 30 interfere with any person present at the location for the purpose of 31 voting.

If the center ¹or school¹ requests that a police officer be 32 assigned, the center ¹or school¹ shall promptly notify the district 33 34 board ¹no later than seven days prior to the day of the election and indicate the duration of their presence¹ and the district board shall 35 36 follow the same procedure for notification in the manner specified 37 in subsection b. of this section. Once notified, the county board of 38 elections or superintendent of elections shall notify the Secretary of 39 State in the same manner specified in subsection b. of this section.

40 b. Nothing in subsection a. of this section, subsection b. of 16 41 R.S.19:6-15, or subsection b. of section 2 of P.L.1991, c.306 42 (C.19:6-15.1) shall be construed to prohibit the dispatch, detail, or assignment of a police officer or other law enforcement officer due 43 44 to a request for assistance made to the commission, committee, 45 board, body, authority, or official having charge of the police 46 department in any county or municipality, or to any other law EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

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1 enforcement agency, for assistance with regard to a specific 2 emergency, allegation of criminal conduct, or disturbance that 3 exists at the time the request for assistance is made. The police 4 officers or law enforcement officers responding to the request for 5 assistance shall take any prompt actions as may be available and as 6 may be necessary in order to address the emergency, allegation, or 7 disturbance and ensure the continued orderly conduct of the election 8 and election processes, and shall remain present at that location 9 during the conduct of the election only as long as necessary to 10 investigate, address, and remove that specific emergency or 11 disturbance.

12 The district board shall promptly notify the county board of elections or superintendent of elections, as appropriate, of the 13 14 dispatch of any police officer or other law enforcement officer in 15 response to a request for assistance in accordance with this 16 subsection. The county board of elections or superintendent of 17 elections, as appropriate, shall promptly notify the Secretary of 18 State of the dispatch of that police officer or other law enforcement 19 officer. The Secretary of State, county boards of elections, and 20 superintendents of elections shall maintain a record of all dispatches 21 issued and reported pursuant to this section, which shall include, but 22 need not be limited to, the time of the dispatch, polling place 23 location, reason for the dispatch, name of the police or law 24 enforcement officer, the police or law enforcement officer's badge 25 number, the duration of the police or law enforcement officer's 26 presence, and the immediate outcome of the dispatch. Information 27 obtained pursuant to this section is deemed to be a public or 28 government record and shall be subject to disclosure as provided in 29 the public records law, P.L.1963, c.73 (C.47:1A-1 et seq.). 30 (cf: P.L.2021, c.459, s.3)

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32 ¹2. (New section) Beginning after January 1, 2023, all schools 33 serving as polling places shall be required to develop security plans 34 to prevent voters from having access to or the ability to interact with students. The security plan shall include a designated area in 35 which voting shall take place that shall be locked and separate from 36 37 the rest of the school if school is in session during the time an 38 election is being held, provided the school has the ability to fulfil 39 the mandate. The Secretary of the Department of Education and the 40 Secretary of State shall notify schools of the security plan mandate immediately after enactment.¹ 41
