1 AN ACT extending the authorization for the Internet gaming law to
2 2033 and amending P.L.2013, c.27.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 36 of P.L.2013, c.27 (C.5:12-95.33) is amended to
8 read as follows:

9 36. a. The Division of Gaming Enforcement shall select the date
10 upon which the provisions of P.L.2013, c.27 (C.5:12-95.17 et al.)
11 shall become operative which shall not be less than three months,
12 nor more than nine months, after the date of enactment, except that
13 upon application by the division, the Casino Control Commission
14 may allow the division, for good cause, to extend the operative date
15 beyond nine months. The division shall provide all casino licensees
16 and applicants with 45 days' notice of the operative date.
17 Notwithstanding this delayed operative date, the division and the
18 commission may take such anticipatory administrative action in
19 advance as may be necessary for the implementation of P.L.2013,
20 c.27 (C.5:12-95.17 et al.).

21 b. The authorization to conduct games through the Internet as
22 provided for in P.L.2013, c.27 shall expire **[10]** 20 years following
23 the operative date established pursuant to subsection a. of this
24 section, unless reauthorized by law.

27 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

32 This bill extends the expiration date for the authorization to
33 conduct games through the Internet to 2033. Under current law, the
34 authorization for Internet gaming is set to expire in November 2023,
35 10 years following the enactment of the original authorization.
