- - 1. a. The Commissioner of Human Services, to the maximum extent permissible under federal law, shall review and streamline the SNAP application process [for senior citizens], as provided in this section. The goal of the streamlining process shall be to [ensure that the number of senior SNAP participants either matches or exceeds New Jersey's overall SNAP participants in New Jersey by increasing the accessibility of the SNAP application.
 - b. In streamlining the SNAP application process [for seniors], as required by this section, the commissioner shall, at a minimum [:
 - (1) develop and make available a simplified SNAP application form for use by seniors;
 - (2) provide for the increased sharing of data between the State's various social services programs and platforms; and
 - (3) authorize, and establish appropriate procedures to facilitate, the simultaneous or cross enrollment of eligible seniors in the Medicaid program and SNAP 1, update the online application system to ensure the system employs current technology and is user friendly, with features that include, but are not limited to, easy account creation, easy user access, and easy tracking of an applicant's application status.
