AN ACT concerning waiver requests for certain eligibility 1 2 requirements under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 3 Program, and amending P.L.2016, c.11. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 1. Section 1 of P.L.2016, c.11 (C.44:10-105) is amended to 8 9 read as follows: 10 Immediately upon the effective date of [this act] 1. a. P.L., c. (C.)(pending before the Legislature as this bill), 11 provided that the federal Public Health Emergency declared by the 12 13 Secretary of Health and Human Services on January 30, 2020 has 14 expired, or within 30 days of the expiration of that federal Public 15 Health Emergency, the Commissioner of Human Services shall 16 submit to the Food and Nutrition Service within the United States 17 Department of Agriculture a request for a waiver, as authorized by 18 7 C.F.R. 273.24(f), of the time limit on benefits for able bodied 19 adults without dependents who participate in the Supplemental 20 Nutrition Assistance Program. The commissioner shall seek either 21 a Statewide waiver for time limits on benefits for this population, or 22 a waiver for select geographic areas of the State. 23 <u>b.</u> [and at]At least once annually ¹[thereafter] <u>after¹</u> the 24 submission of the waiver pursuant to subsection a. of this section, 25 the [Commissioner of Human Services] <u>commissioner</u> shall 26 conduct a review of available data on labor and employment in the 27 State produced by the Department of Labor and Workforce 28 Development and the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. The 29 purpose of the review shall be <u>in order</u> to determine whether to 30 submit a subsequent request for a waiver of the benefit time limit 31 for able bodied adults without dependents participating in the 32 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program [as authorized by 7] C.F.R. 273.24(f), either throughout the State or in any geographic 33 34 area of the State]. The review shall consider each criterion of eligibility for a waiver as well as the availability of opportunities 35 36 that will fulfill the work requirement described in 7 C.F.R. 37 273.24(a). Based on the <u>annual</u> review conducted pursuant to this [section] <u>subsection</u>, the commissioner shall [determine whether 38 to] submit a request for a waiver, when in compliance with federal 39 guidance, either for the entire State, if all geographic areas in the 40 41 State meet the waiver eligibility criteria, or for any geographic areas 42 of the State that meet such eligibility criteria. 43 (cf: P.L.2016, c.11, s.1)
