SYNOPSIS

Requires school food vendors to engage in public education campaigns and develop promotional materials to educate parents and guardians of students about existing and expanding school meals program options.

AN ACT concerning the promotion of, and the education of parents 1 2 and guardians regarding, school meals programs that are 3 operating, or that are subject to expansion, in the State, and 4 amending P.L.2019, c.307. 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. Section 1 of P.L.2019, c.307 (C.18A:33-27.1) is amended to 10 read as follows: 1. a. ¹[The Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the 11 Department of Education, <u>Each food service vendor or food</u> 12 13 service management company that provides a food service to 14 students at a public school in the State¹ shall: 15 (1) develop and implement a public education campaign to educate ¹the¹ parents and guardians ¹[in the State] of students at 16 schools served by the vendor or management company¹ about the 17 18 various school meals programs that are available for students in 19 <u>New Jersey, and</u> ¹<u>about</u>¹ <u>the availability of free and reduced price</u> meals, under such programs, for students who satisfy federal or 20 21 State-level eligibility criteria; and (2) develop promotional [material] materials for the ["School 22 23 Meal Program"] State's school meals programs, and provide ¹[such] copies of the¹ promotional materials to ¹[every] each¹ 24 school ¹[district]¹ [with the "School Meal Program" promotional 25 material, which shall ¹that is served by the vendor or management 26 company¹ in the State, for distribution ¹ [thereby], by school staff,¹ 27 to the parents and guardians of students who are enrolled at 28 ¹[schools in the district.] the school. The food service vendor or 29 30 food service management company shall utilize existing resources, which have been made available by the United States Department of 31 32 Agriculture and the State Department of Agriculture, in developing promotional materials for the purposes of this paragraph.¹ The 33 promotional materials developed pursuant to this paragraph shall 34 35 include, but need not be limited to, pamphlets, presentation [material] <u>materials</u>, webinars, and sample letters <u>that</u> schools may 36 37 send to parents and guardians. 38 b. The ["School Meal Program"] public education campaign and promotional [material] materials developed under subsection a. 39 of this section shall: 40 (1) ¹satisfy the standards, and comply with the guidelines, 41 established by the Department of Agriculture, in consultation with 42 43 the Department of Education, pursuant to subsection c. of this 44 section;

Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, the 36 Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the Department of 37 Education, shall adopt standards and guidelines to ensure the 38 uniformity and accuracy of school meals-related information being 39 presented by food service vendors and food service management 40 companies as part of the educational campaigns conducted, and in 41 the promotional materials distributed, pursuant to this section.¹ 42 (cf: P.L.2019, c.307, s.1) 43 44 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
