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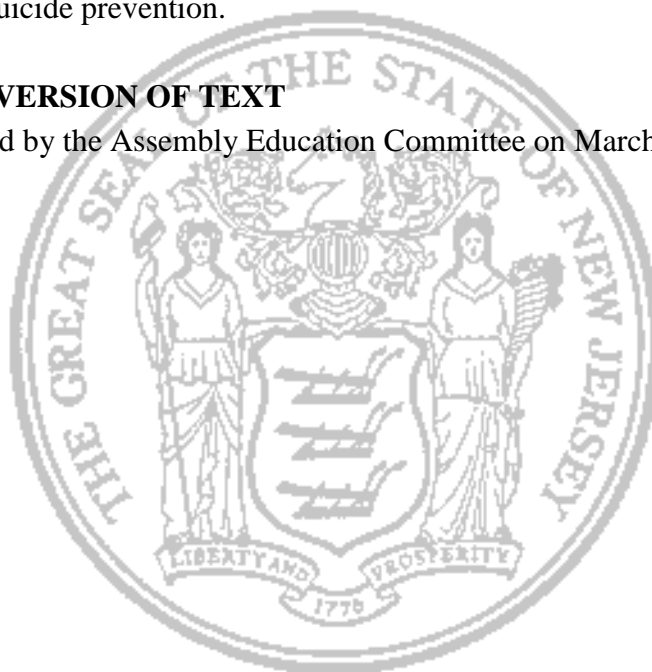

SYNOPSIS

Requires certain additional school district personnel to complete training program on suicide prevention.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

1 AN ACT concerning annual suicide prevention instruction for
 2 certain public school personnel and amending P.L.2005, c.310.

 4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
 5 *of New Jersey:*

 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-112) is amended to
 8 read as follows:

9 2. a. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the
 10 New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory Council established
 11 in the Department of Children and Families pursuant to
 12 P.L.2003, c.214 (C.30:9A-22 et seq.), shall, as part of the
 13 professional development requirement established by the State
 14 board for public school teaching staff members, require each public
 15 school teaching staff member to complete at least two hours of
 16 instruction in suicide prevention, to be provided by a licensed
 17 health care professional with training and experience in mental
 18 health issues, in each professional development period. The
 19 instruction in suicide prevention shall include information on the
 20 relationship between the risk of suicide and incidents of harassment,
 21 intimidation, and bullying and information on reducing the risk of
 22 suicide in students who are members of communities identified as
 23 having members at high risk of suicide.

24 b. Not including teaching staff members subject to the
 25 requirements of subsection a. of this section ¹and not including
 26 licensed mental health care professionals¹, a school employee or an
 27 employee of a contracted service provider who has regular and
 28 direct contact with students, as determined by the board of
 29 education, shall complete a one-time training program in suicide
 30 prevention, awareness, and response ¹[developed or]¹ identified by
 31 the Department of Education pursuant to subsection c. of this
 32 section. A person subject to the requirements of this subsection
 33 shall complete the required training program not less than 12
 34 months from the date of the ¹[development or]¹ identification by
 35 the department of training programs ¹[and the development of the
 36 fact sheet]¹ or 12 months from the person's date of hire, whichever
 37 occurs later.

38 c. The Department of Education, in consultation with the
 39 Department of Children and Families, the Department of Human
 40 Services, the New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory
 41 Council, suicide prevention experts, and interested stakeholders in
 42 the education community, shall¹[:

43 (1) develop or]¹ identify training programs on suicide
 44 prevention, awareness, and response that persons subject to the
 45 requirements of subsection b. of this section may access and

1 complete, free of charge, to fulfill the requirements. The
2 department may enter into an agreement with one or more private
3 entities to make a training program available, free of charge, to
4 persons subject to the requirements of subsection b. of this
5 section¹; and

6 (2) develop an educational fact sheet on suicide prevention,
7 awareness, and response. The educational fact sheet shall include,
8 but not be limited to, model guidance, best practices, and
9 educational resources that will assist school districts in developing
10 their own suicide prevention, awareness, and response protocols.
11 Among the best practices that districts are encouraged to consider in
12 staff training and in the development of school district protocols is
13 the use of table-top exercises where appropriate staff rehearse
14 scenarios in the event of a suicide impacting the school district.

15 The educational fact sheet shall be made available on the
16 department's website and shall be distributed, at no charge, to all
17 school districts. The department shall update the educational fact
18 sheet on an annual basis in accordance with trends in the field of
19 youth suicide prevention¹.

20 d. ¹Beginning in the first full school year Not less than 12
21 months¹ following the date of the ¹development or¹ identification
22 by the department of the training programs ¹and the development
23 of the educational fact sheet,] or not less than 12 months from the
24 person's date of hire,¹ and annually thereafter, each school district
25 and contracted service provider shall provide to their employees
26 who are subject to the requirements of subsection a. or b. of this
27 section, in a hard copy paper form or in an electronic form¹:

28 (1) the educational fact sheet developed pursuant to paragraph
29 (2) of subsection c. of this section; and

30 (2)¹ guidelines on the school district's reporting and
31 suicide prevention, awareness, and response protocols including,
32 but not limited to, contact information for each school's designated
33 staff who should be notified whenever an employee believes a
34 student may be at risk for suicide.

35 e. A school district shall provide information concerning its
36 compliance with the requirements of this section in the New Jersey
37 Quality Single Accountability Continuum Statement of Assurance
38 submitted by the district to the executive county superintendent of
39 schools. A contracted service provider shall annually provide a
40 statement of assurance to the school district concerning its
41 compliance with the provisions of subsections b. and d. of this
42 section.

43 f. ¹(1) No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or
44 damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the
45 implementation of the provisions of this section or resulting from
46 any training, or lack thereof, required by this section.

1 (2) The training, or lack thereof, required by the provisions of
2 this section shall not be construed to impose any specific duty of
3 care.】 Each person who is required pursuant to subsection a. or
4 subsection b. of this section to complete a suicide prevention
5 training program shall have a duty to warn and protect when the
6 following conditions exist:

7 (1) a student has communicated to that person a clearly
8 identifiable threat of imminent, serious physical violence against
9 oneself and the circumstances are such that a reasonable person
10 would believe the student intended to carry out the threat; or

11 (2) the circumstances are such that a reasonable person would
12 believe the student intended to carry out an act of imminent, serious
13 physical violence against oneself.

14 A person acting in good faith and who takes reasonable steps to
15 discharge a duty to warn and protect shall be immune from civil and
16 criminal liability in regard to that disclosure.¹

19 2. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall remain
20 inoperative until the Department of Education has ¹【developed or】¹
21 identified and made available to school districts the training
22 programs ¹【and developed the educational fact sheet】¹ required
23 pursuant to subsection c. of section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-
24 112).
