## **SYNOPSIS**

Requires professional licensing boards to issue licenses for certain individuals with good standing licenses or certification in other jurisdictions under certain circumstances.

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1 AN ACT concerning professional and occupational licenses and 2 supplementing P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-14 et seq.). 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 1. a. 8 contrary, a professional or occupational board designated in section 9 2 of P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-15) that issues a professional or 10 occupational license, certificate of registration, or certification for 11 which professional training, education, or experience is required, 12 shall issue a license, certificate of registration, or certification to an 13 applicant, for the time the applicant is domiciled in this State, if that applicant possesses a license, certificate of registration, or 14 15 certification and equivalent training, education, and experience for 16 that profession or occupation obtained in another state, district, or 17 territory of the United States of America, regardless of when the 18 license, certificate of registration, or certification and training, 19 education, or experience was obtained. 20 b. A professional or occupational board shall issue a license, certificate of registration, or certification to an applicant who 21 22 presents evidence to the board that: 23 (1) the applicant's license, certificate of registration, or 24 certification is in good standing in another jurisdiction; and 25 (2) the applicant complies with all other requirements for 26 licensure, including but not limited to, any requirement for 27 examination. c. A professional or occupational board may require an 28 29 applicant to provide any documentation of the applicant's training, 30 education, or experience, as it deems necessary to determine 31 eligibility. 32 d. A professional or occupational board shall provide methods 33 of evaluating equivalent training, education, or experience obtained 34 towards meeting the requirements for the issuance of a license, 35 certificate of registration, or certification pursuant to this section, provided that no method of evaluating experience from another 36 37 jurisdiction shall operate in such a manner as to require the same 38 number of hours of experience by the applicant. 39 As used in this section, "applicant" means the spouse of an e. 40 active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States. 41 42 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the third month next following the date of enactment, except that a board may take 43 44 any anticipatory administrative action in advance of that date as 45 shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.

## STATEMENT

This bill requires professional and occupational boards to issue a license, certificate of registration, or certification to any applicant who received a license and equivalent training, education, or experience in other state or jurisdiction of the United States for the time the applicant is domiciled in this State.

8 The bill requires a professional and occupational board to issue a 9 license, certificate, or certification to an applicant who presents 10 evidence to the board that: (1) the applicant's license, certificate of 11 registration, or certification is in good standing in another 12 jurisdiction; and (2) the applicant complies with all other 13 requirements for licensure, including any requirement for 14 examination.

15 The bill also requires each board to provide methods of 16 evaluating equivalent training, education, or experience obtained 17 towards meeting the requirements for the issuance of a license, 18 certificate of registration, or certification. However, no method of 19 evaluation shall operate in such a manner as to require the same 20 number of hours of experience by the applicant.

21 This bill provides reciprocity for individuals with a license, 22 certificate of registration, or certification issued by another 23 jurisdiction of the United States. Individuals with these credentials 24 from other states face barriers to entering the job market because 25 professional and occupational licenses are often not transferable 26 from state to state. This bill would allow individuals licensed in 27 another jurisdiction to obtain a new license in New Jersey by virtue of their licensure in another state or other jurisdiction of the United 28 29 States and would make it easier for those individuals to find or keep 30 employment in this State.

The bill defines an applicant as a person who is the spouse of anactive duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States.

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
