SYNOPSIS

Establishes program for certain individuals to become certified as homemaker-home health aides and provide services to certain Medicaid enrollees.

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AN ACT concerning ¹[certified nursing assistants] <u>homemaker-</u>
 <u>home health aides</u>¹ and home care services and supplementing
 P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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11 12 a. ²<u>As used in this section, "family member" means a child,</u> parent, parent-in-law, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, spouse, domestic partner, or one partner in a civil union couple, or any other individual related by blood, and any other individual with a close association that is the equivalent of a family relationship.

<u>b.</u>² No later than 1 [six] <u>nine</u> 1 months after the effective date of 13 this act ¹and receipt of federal approval for the program¹, the Division 14 15 of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services shall establish a program under which a family 16 17 member of an enrollee in Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare²[, or a thirdparty individual approved by the parent or guardian of an enrollee in 18 Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare, **]**² may ²<u>seek to</u>² be certified ²<u>by the New</u> 19 Jersey Board of Nursing² as ¹[certified nursing assistant] <u>a</u> 20 homemaker-home health aide¹ and, ²after receiving that certification, 21 may,² under the direction of a registered nurse, provide ¹[certified 22 nursing assistant] homemaker-home health aide¹ services to the 23 enrollee through a ² [private duty nursing] <u>home care services</u>² agency 24 ²[under the reimbursement rates established pursuant to subsection d. 25 of this section]², provided that the enrollee is under 21 years of age 26 and ²otherwise² qualifies ² [for private duty nursing] to receive those² 27 services under Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare. 28 The division shall 29 develop an assessment tool that will allow the division to readily 30 identify enrollees who meet these eligibility criteria.

²[b.] \underline{c} .² The program established pursuant to this section shall 31 require the family member ²[or approved third-party individual]² to 32 33 complete all the training, testing, and other qualification criteria as are 34 required under State and federal law for certification as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-home health aide</u>¹. The ²[private duty 35 nursing] <u>home care</u>² services agency that will employ the family 36 member ²[or approved third-party individual]² to provide ²[private 37 duty nursing] homemaker-home health aide² services to the enrollee 38 shall pay all costs for the family member ²[or approved third-party 39 individual² to become certified as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] 40 homemaker-home health aide¹², and to receive certification as a 41 homemaker-home health aide from the New Jersey Board of Nursing, 42 before providing services under the program established pursuant to 43 <u>this section²</u>. 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party individual]² who becomes a certified ¹[nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-home health aide</u>¹ under the ²[provisions of] <u>program</u> <u>established pursuant to</u>² this section be required to repay or reimburse the ²[private duty nursing] <u>home care</u>² services agency for the costs of the family member ²[or approved third-party individual]² becoming certified as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemakerhome health aide</u>¹ under the program.

²[c. The tasks delegated by a registered nurse to a family member
who becomes certified as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-</u>
<u>home health aide</u>¹ pursuant to this section shall be consistent with the
tasks that may be generally delegated to ¹[certified nursing assistants]

14 d. ¹[Certified nursing assistant] <u>Homemaker-home health aide¹</u> services provided by a family member of a Medicaid or NJ 15 16 FamilyCare enrollee or an approved third-party individual who becomes certified as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-home</u> 17 health aide¹ under the program established pursuant to this section 18 shall be reimbursed $\frac{1}{to a}$ private duty nursing agency¹ at a rate of no 19 less than \$30 per hour for such time as the enrollee is under 21 years 20 21 of age.

¹e.] d.² The Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services shall, no later than three years after the date the program is established pursuant to this section, prepare and submit a report to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature, concerning the viability of the program and the director's recommendations concerning the program.¹

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2. The Assistant Commissioner of the Division of Medical
Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human
Services ²and the New Jersey Board of Nursing² shall ²each² adopt
rules and regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure
Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as are necessary to
implement the provisions of this act.
