This act shall take effect immediately. 19 20 21 **STATEMENT** 22 23 This bill directs the Commissioner of Education to study the 24 need for, and the advisability of, increasing the curriculum 25 requirements for the study of geography in high school. The study 26 must include an evaluation of the potential positive and negative 27 consequences associated with enhancing the geography education The commissioner will report his findings and 28 requirements. 29 recommendations within 6 months of the bill's effective date to the 30 State Board of Education, the Governor, and the Legislature. 31 There is currently no requirement that a high school student complete a course dedicated solely to geography. Under current 32 33 State Board of Education regulations (N.J.A.C.6A:8-5.1), a student 34 must complete at least 15 credits in social studies in order to be eligible to receive a State-endorsed high school diploma. All social 35 studies course offerings must integrate civics, economics, 36 37 geography, and global content within the curriculum.
