## SYNOPSIS

Appropriates \$70 million in federal funds to EDA to support arts and culture organizations negatively impacted by COVID-19 pandemic.

1 AN ACT appropriating federal funds to the New Jersey Economic 2 Development Authority to support arts and culture organizations 3 impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. Subject to the availability of federal funds allocated to the 9 State from the federal "Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund," 10 established pursuant to the federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 11 2021," Pub.L. 117-2, \$70 million from such federal funds shall be 12 appropriated to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority 13 for the purpose of awarding grants to qualifying arts and culture 14 organizations, as set forth in this section. 15 b. (1) Of the federal funds appropriated pursuant to subsection 16 a. of this section, the authority, in consultation with the council, 17 shall award \$50 million in grants to support the financial recovery, 18 resiliency, and growth of qualifying arts and culture organizations. 19 Of this total, \$10 million in grants shall be dedicated to arts 20 education organizations that provide programs and services for 21 school districts, charter schools, or organizations offering 22 afterschool programs, free of charge, for participating students. 23 (2) The grants awarded under this subsection may be used to 24 offset any revenue losses that occurred as a direct result of the 25 COVID-19 pandemic or provide the cash reserves necessary to 26 ensure continued operations in the event of future pandemic-related 27 shutdowns. 28 c. Of the federal funds appropriated pursuant to subsection a. 29 of this section, the authority, in consultation with the council, shall 30 award \$20 million in grants to qualifying arts and culture 31 organizations to support the completion of placemaking projects. d. Any arts or culture organization that seeks a grant pursuant 32 33 to this section shall submit an application to the authority in a form 34 and manner prescribed by the authority. The authority shall 35 approve the applications on a rolling basis, subject to the 36 availability of funds. 37 e. The authority may adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 38 39 seq.), to effectuate the provisions of this section. 40 As used in this section: f. 41 "Authority" means the New Jersey Economic Development 42 Authority, established by section 4 of P.L.1974, c.80 (C.34:1B-4). "Council" means the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, 43 44 established pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1966, c.214 (C.52:16A-25). 45 "Placemaking project" means any creative or artistic project 46 intended to beautify or enrich public spaces, including, but not limited to, artistic paintings on roadways or sidewalks, landscape 47

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1 plantings in public areas, educational signage, and other artistic, 2 cultural, or educational installations. "Qualifying arts and culture organization" means any arts and 3 culture organization, including for-profit businesses and non-profit 4 5 organizations, that was negatively impacted by the COVID-19 6 pandemic. 7 8 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 9 10 11 **STATEMENT** 12 This bill appropriates \$70 million in federal funds to the New 13 14 Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA) to support arts and 15 culture organizations, including for-profit businesses and non-profit 16 organizations, that were negatively impacted by the COVID-19 17 pandemic. 18 Under the bill, the EDA, in consultation with the New Jersey 19 State Council on the Arts (council), would be required to award \$50 20 million in grants to support the financial recovery, resiliency, and 21 growth of qualifying arts and culture organizations. However, of this total, \$10 million in grants would be dedicated to arts education 22 23 organizations that provide programs and services for public schools 24 or afterschool programs. Specifically, these grants may be used to 25 offset any revenue losses that occurred as a direct result of the 26 COVID-19 pandemic or provide the cash reserves necessary to 27 ensure continued operations in the event of future pandemic-related 28 shutdowns. 29 Additionally, the bill requires the EDA, in consultation with the 30 council, to award \$20 million in grants to qualifying arts and culture 31 organizations to support the completion of placemaking projects in 32 public spaces. Under the bill, placemaking projects would include 33 any creative or artistic project intended to beautify or enrich public 34 spaces, such as artistic paintings on roadways or sidewalks, 35 landscape plantings in public areas, educational signage, and other artistic, cultural, or educational installations. 36 37 The monies appropriated under the bill would be provided from the State's allocation of funds from the federal "Coronavirus State 38 39 Fiscal Recovery Fund," established pursuant to the federal
