Requires State to foster development and implementation of graduate medical education programs in behavioral health care.

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implemented in New Jersey include programs in both physical health care and behavioral health care.

The bill additionally requires the Commissioner of Human Services to apply for such State plan amendments or waivers as may be necessary to secure federal financial participation for State Medicaid expenditures under the federal Medicaid program for the purpose of establishing additional graduate medical education slots focused on behavioral health care.

Contingent on approval of the requested State plan amendments or waivers, the Commissioner of Human Services and the Secretary of Higher Education will be required to establish a process for graduate medical education programs to request and use Medicaid funds to establish additional graduate medical education programs focused on behavioral health care.

It is the sponsor's intent to ensure that the State fosters training in behavioral health care to help foster a robust behavioral health care workforce in New Jersey. According to the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP), New Jersey had 44 Psychiatry resident positions available in the 2021 Match, all of which were filled, suggesting that there is an existing demand for behavioral health care graduate medical education slots that would support the creation of new slots and help expand the behavioral health care workforce.
