### STATEMENT

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This FY 23 supplemental appropriation provides \$3.6 million to 3 the Department of Human Services to increase the adult medical 4 5 day care Medicaid per diem rate by four percent from \$86.10 to \$89.54. Adult medical day care services provide medically 6 7 necessary services in an ambulatory care setting to individuals who 8 are nonresidents of the facility, and who, due to their physical or 9 cognitive impairment, require such services to support their 10 community living. The adult medical day care per diem rate was increased from \$78.50 to \$82 in FY 21, and from \$82 to the current 11 12 rate in FY 22. Prior to these increases, the per diem rate was static 13 at \$78.50 since FY 12.
