Makes FY 2023 supplemental Grants-in-Aid appropriation of \$150,000 to Department of State for Old School Baptist Church and Meeting House located in Hopewell Borough (Mercer County).

4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and the General Assembly of the

8 the annual appropriations act for the fiscal year ending June 30,
9 2023, there is appropriated from the General Fund the following

29 STATEMENT

30
31 This bill provides a supplemental appropriation of \$150,000 to
32 the Department of State for the Old School Baptist Church and
33 Meeting House located in the Borough of Hopewell, Mercer
34 County. The bill requires the funding to be used to establish a
35 program that educates and informs the public on the impact of the
36 Old School Baptist Church on the development of Hopewell
37 Borough and the surrounding community.

38 The Old School Baptist Church and Meeting House was
39 originally built in the late 1740s on land donated by John Hart. Mr.
40 Hart, one of five delegates from New Jersey to the Second
41 Continental Congress and a signer of the Declaration of
42 Independence, is buried in a cemetery that is part of the church
43 property.
