SYNOPSIS

Regulates provision of pharmaceutical services in nursing homes.

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AN ACT concerning ¹ [long-term care facilities] <u>nursing homes</u>¹ and 1 2 pharmaceutical services and supplementing Title 26 of the 3 **Revised Statutes**. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. As used in this act: 9 ¹["Long-term care facility" means a nursing home, assisted 10 living residence, comprehensive personal care home, residential 11 health care facility, or dementia care home licensed pursuant to 12 P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.)] "Nursing home" means a 13 long-term care facility licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, c.136 14 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.) to provide professional nursing care on a daily 15 basis and includes intermediate care facilities pursuant to P.L.1975, 16 c.397 (C.26:2H-29 et seq.), as well as the distinct part of another 17 health care facility or continuing care retirement community that is 18 licensed to provide skilled nursing care services pursuant to 19 P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.). For the purposes of this act, 20 nursing home shall not include: an acute care hospital; assisted 21 living facility; comprehensive personal care home; dementia care home; residential health care facility; adult day health care facility; 22 23 alternate family care program; adult family care program; home 24 health care agency; State psychiatric hospital; county health care 25 facility, including, but not limited to, county geriatric center, county 26 nursing home or other county long-term care facility; the New 27 Jersey Firemen's Home; or a health care facility operated by the 28 Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs¹. 29 "Pharmacist" means a pharmacist licensed pursuant to P.L.2003, 30 c.280 (C.45:14-40 et seq.) b. Each ¹[long-term care facility] <u>nursing home</u>¹ shall have a 31 consultant pharmacist and either a provider pharmacist or, if the 32 33 facility has an in-house pharmacy, a director of pharmaceutical 34 services. c. A New Jersey licensed pharmacist shall serve as director of 35 36 pharmaceutical services or as consultant pharmacist. The 37 pharmacist shall comply with federal and State statutes, rules, 38 regulations, and currently accepted standards of practice. d. Each ¹[long-term care facility] <u>nursing home</u>¹ shall have an 39 40 interdisciplinary pharmacy and therapeutics committee, appointed 41 by and reporting to the facility's administrator and consisting of at 42 least the administrator, a representative of the nursing staff, and the facility's consultant pharmacist, with oversight as needed by the 43 44 facility's medical director. The committee may include a licensed 45 pharmacist representing the provider pharmacy. The committee

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shall hold meetings at least quarterly. Records, including the dates
of meetings, attendance, activities, findings, and recommendations,
shall be maintained by the committee.

e. Each ¹[long-term care facility] <u>nursing home</u>¹ shall appoint 4 a consultant pharmacist who is not also the director of 5 pharmaceutical services or pharmacist provider, and who attests that 6 7 he or she does not have an affiliation with either the facility's 8 director of pharmaceutical services or the facility's pharmacist 9 provider. Following the appointment of the consultant pharmacist, the consultant pharmacist shall avoid all real or potential conflicts 10 of interest with the facility's director of pharmaceutical services or 11 12 the facility's pharmacist provider.

13 f. If a **'[**long-term care facility**]** <u>nursing home</u>¹ keeps 14 emergency injectable or oral controlled substances, the facility shall 15 ensure that a current Drug Enforcement Administration registration 16 and controlled dangerous substance registration for that location is 17 available.

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2. The Commissioner of Health shall adopt rules and regulations,
in accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968,
c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as are necessary to effectuate the
provisions of this act.
