SYNOPSIS

Requires Commissioner of Education to establish matching grant program for certain school districts and schools using federal funds to increase instructional time and accelerate learning.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. a. The Commissioner of Education shall establish a matching 8 grant program to support school districts, charter schools, and 9 renaissance school projects that use a portion of their eligible funds 10 to increase student instructional time and accelerate student learning 11 through the implementation of high-quality, evidence-based 12 interventions and programs that address the academic, social, and 13 emotional needs of students in the district according to the provisions of this section. Eligible funds under this section shall be 14 15 a school district, charter school, or renaissance school project's 16 local educational agency subgrant from the Elementary and 17 Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund allocated pursuant to the 18 formula under section 2001(d)(1) of the federal American Rescue 19 Plan Act of 2021, excluding any amount required to be reserved by 20 the district or school to address learning loss and the other purposes 21 enumerated in section 2001(e)(1) of that act. A school district, 22 charter school, or renaissance school project shall be eligible to 23 apply for funds under the grant program only if, among all students 24 in the district or school to whom a State assessment was 25 administered, the sum of the percent of students in the "did not yet 26 meet expectations" and the "partially met expectations" categories 27 in the English language arts or mathematics subject areas increased 28 according to the most recently administered State assessments for 29 which data is available, compared to the corresponding sum in the 30 2018-2019 school year.

31 b. The purpose of the matching grant program shall be to assist 32 school districts, charter schools, and renaissance school projects in 33 implementing interventions and programs that supplement 34 traditional classroom instruction and that respond to interrupted 35 learning time and learning loss among students resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. A district or school that receives a matching 36 37 grant under the program shall use the grant to augment the eligible 38 funds dedicated to interventions and programs including:

39 (1) comprehensive before-school, after-school, and out-of-40 school learning programs;

41 (2) summer learning academies or summer enrichment42 programs;

43 (3) during-school or out-of-school time tutoring programs,
44 including one-on-one tutoring and high-impact or high-dosage
45 tutoring;

46 (4) hiring additional staff that would increase student access to
47 additional learning opportunities or provide more individualized
48 instruction to students;

(5) project-based learning or work-based learning opportunities
 and programs;

3 (6) increasing student access to postsecondary opportunities,
4 including dual enrollment programs, early college high school
5 programs, and career pathway programs that integrate academic
6 coursework, career and technical education, work-based learning,
7 and support services; and

8 (7) any other intervention or program that the commissioner 9 deems necessary to supplement traditional classroom instruction 10 and respond to interrupted learning time and learning loss among 11 students resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

c. A school district, charter school, or renaissance school project
seeking funds under the grant program shall submit an application
to the commissioner. In addition to any other information deemed
necessary by the commissioner, the application shall include:

(1) a description of the manner in which the district or school
will use its eligible funds to increase student instructional time and
accelerate student learning and in what ways the district's
intervention or program is high-quality in nature;

(2) a description of the need to increase student instructional
time and accelerate student learning, including an analysis of
relevant assessment data and other information concerning the
extent of interrupted learning or learning loss experienced by
students in the district as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic;

(3) evidence that the district or school's intervention or program
will lead to positive student outcomes and reduce the level of
learning loss among the student population at-large and any student
subgroups, including available evidence that a similar intervention
or program has been effective in other school districts or states;

30 (4) an explanation concerning how the intervention or program
31 will support students in not only meeting grade-level expectations
32 but also in preparing them for further education;

(5) a description of the specific student subgroups on which the
district's intervention or program focuses, if any, and the effect that
the intervention or program will have in addressing the
disproportionate impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the
academic, social, and emotional needs of students in the subgroups;

38 (6) a description of any grade levels or subject areas on which
39 the district is seeking to focus its intervention or program;

40 (7) details concerning any partnerships into which the district or
41 school will enter with community-based organizations or other
42 entities for the purposes of implementing its intervention or
43 program;

44 (8) an explanation of the measures on which the district or45 school will measure the success of its intervention or program;

46 (9) the amount of eligible funds that is dedicated to the
47 intervention or program to increase student instructional time and
48 accelerate student learning; and

1 (10) an updated Plan for Use of American Rescue Plan 2 Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds if the 3 district or school chooses to make substantial changes to its 4 previously submitted plan as a result of the matching grant 5 opportunity established pursuant to this section.

6 d. If the commissioner approves the application, the school 7 district, charter school, or renaissance school project shall receive a 8 matching grant equal to 50 percent of the amount of the district or 9 school's eligible funds that is dedicated to the intervention or 10 program to increase student instructional time and accelerate 11 student learning as specified in its application pursuant to paragraph 12 (9) of subsection c. of this section.

e. The aggregate amount of funds provided to school districts, charter schools, and renaissance school projects pursuant to the grant program shall not exceed \$200,000,000. The grants provided pursuant to this section shall, to the extent permitted by federal law, be funded from the monies received by the State under the federal %American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act," Pub.L.117-2.

19 f. No later than July 30 of each school year in which matching 20 grants are distributed pursuant to this section, the commissioner 21 shall submit to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to 22 section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), a report that evaluates 23 the effectiveness of the grant program in increasing student 24 achievement and reducing the level of interrupted learning or 25 learning loss in each school district that receives a matching grant.

STATEMENT

32 This bill requires the Commissioner of Education to establish a 33 matching grant program to support school districts that use a 34 portion of their eligible funds to increase student instructional time 35 and accelerate student learning. Eligible funds as defined in the bill 36 are moneys under a school district, charter school, or renaissance 37 school project's local educational agency subgrant from the 38 American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act ESSER Fund, excluding any 39 amount required by the provisions of the ARP Act to be spent on 40 evidence-based learning loss interventions. A district or school 41 would be eligible to apply for funds under the grant program only if 42 the percentage of students in the district or school who are not 43 meeting or partially meeting grade-level expectation increased 44 compared to the 2018-2019 school year. The aggregate amount of 45 funds provided to school districts, charter schools, or renaissance 46 school projects under the bill would not exceed \$200 million. Under 47 the bill, the program would be funded from the monies received by 48 the State under the federal ARP Act.

1 A school district, charter school, or renaissance school project 2 seeking funds under the program is required to submit an application to the commissioner that is to include certain 3 information enumerated in the bill. If the commissioner approves 4 5 the application, the school district will receive a matching grant 6 equal to 50 percent of the amount of the district's local educational 7 agency federal allotment under the ARP Act that is dedicated to the 8 intervention or program to increase student instructional time and 9 accelerate student learning which has been specified in its 10 application.
