Notwithstanding any other law or regulation to the contrary, the amount hereinabove appropriated for the Child Care Employer Innovation Pilot Program shall be paid to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority for deposit into the Child Care Facilities Fund.

Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection a. of section 9 of P.L.2022, c.25, or any other law or regulation, to the contrary, the amount appropriated to effectuate the provisions of section 3 of P.L.2022, c.25 (C.30:5B-38) shall be paid to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority for deposit into the Child Care Facilities Fund.

3. In addition to the amounts appropriated under P.L.2022, c.49, the annual appropriations act for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, there are appropriated from the Property Tax Relief Fund the following amounts for the purposes specified:

5 **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

6 82. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 8 of P.L.1992, c.160
7 (C.26:2H-18.58) or any other law or regulation to the contrary, an
8 amount not to exceed **[\$661,865,000]** \$984,886,000, as determined
9 by the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting, is
10 appropriated from the Health Care Subsidy Fund to the Division of
11 Medical Assistance and Health Services to fund Medical Coverage -
12 Title XIX Parents and Children in the General Medical Services
13 program classification.

15 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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18 **STATEMENT**

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20 This bill supplements the FY 2023 Appropriations Act with an
21 additional \$158,525,000 in spending authority, of which \$75,084,000
22 is from the General Fund and \$83,441,000 is from the Property Tax
23 Relief Fund. The bill also adds and modifies certain language
24 provisions of the FY 2023 Appropriations Act.

25
26 ***Department of Corrections:***

27
28 This bill appropriates \$16,800,000 in Direct State Services
29 funding for Materials and Supplies due to increased costs related to
30 food for incarcerated persons, facility supplies, and fuel and utility
31 costs.

32
33 ***Department of Education:***

34
35 This bill appropriates \$83,222,000 in State Aid from the Property
36 Tax Relief Fund to bring New Jersey in compliance with the
37 maintenance of equity requirements set forth in the federal American
38 Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

39
40 ***Department of Environmental Protection:***

41
42 This bill appropriates \$12,821,000 in Capital Construction
43 funding for hazardous substance discharge and private underground
44 storage tank remediation as dedicated by Article VIII, Section II,
45 paragraph 6 of the State Constitution.

46 This bill appropriates \$3,771,000 in Direct State Services funding
47 for water resources monitoring and planning as dedicated by Article
48 VIII, Section II, paragraph 6 of the State Constitution.

1 This bill appropriates \$382,000 in Grants-in-Aid funding from the
2 General Fund for the Lake Hopatcong Commission to support the
3 anticipated loss of revenue collections for boating licenses that were
4 associated with the temporary waiver of driver's license fees.

6 *Department of Human Services:*

7

8 This bill appropriates \$1,310,000 in State Aid funding from the
9 General Fund due to increased administrative costs in the
10 Supplemental Security Income Program.

11

12 *Department of the Treasury:*

13

14 This bill appropriates \$40,000,000 in Grants-in-Aid funding from
15 the General Fund for the Green Fund, which shifts the appropriation
16 from fiscal year 2024 to fiscal year 2023.

17

18 This bill appropriates \$219,000 in State Aid funding from the
19 Property Tax Relief Fund for the South Jersey Port Corporation to
20 make additional PILOT payments to Paulsboro per an agreement
21 between the Borough of Paulsboro and the South Jersey Port
22 Corporation.

23

24 The bill also adds new language to allow certain funds to be used
25 for a current program which provides grants to licensed child care
26 providers for the purpose of making improvements to their child care
27 facilities, in accordance with an application process and eligibility
28 requirements determined by the New Jersey Economic Development
29 Authority.

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31 Finally, the bill modifies existing language in the FY 2023
32 Appropriations Act to increase the amount available from the Health
33 Care Subsidy Fund to the Division of Medical Assistance and Health
34 Services (DMAHS) to fund Medical Coverage – Title XIX Parents
35 and Children in the General Medical Services program classification.
