#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires establishment of pilot program for mosquito control activities by State Mosquito Control Commission for certain municipalities.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



AN ACT establishing a pilot program for mosquito control for certain municipalities and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

#### 1. a. As used in this section:

"Qualified municipality" means any municipality with a population under 10,000 in a county of the second class with a population between 300,000 and 330,000, according to the most recent federal decennial census.

"State Mosquito Control Commission" or "commission" means the State Mosquito Control Commission established pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1956, c.135 (C.26:9-12.3).

- b. The State Mosquito Control Commission shall establish a five-year pilot program for mosquito control activities in any qualified municipality in the State. Any qualified municipality may elect to participate in the pilot program. The commission shall provide oversight for mosquito control activities performed under the program. The commission shall establish a partnership with a qualified municipality that participates in the program and shall provide technical and other assistance in developing a mosquito control plan for the municipality. The commission shall, within the limits of monies appropriated for such purposes, provide financial assistance to a participating qualified municipality for the implementation of its mosquito control plan.
- c. The Commissioner of Health may provide for airplane spraying for mosquito extermination pursuant to R.S.26:9-10 in a municipality that participates in the pilot program, in accordance with the health needs of the municipality.
- d. A qualified municipality that participates in the pilot program shall:
- (1) designate a member of the governing body to oversee mosquito control activities performed by the municipality;
- (2) cooperate with the State Mosquito Control Commission by providing information and performing services as requested by the commission;
- (3) develop a mosquito control plan for the work to exterminate mosquitos and eliminate their breeding places within the municipality, to be performed in the upcoming year;
- (4) submit to the commission, annually, a detailed estimate of the moneys required to implement the mosquito control plan for the upcoming year;
- (5) follow best management practices or other standards and guidelines for mosquito control activities in the State; and
- (6) annually prepare and submit a report to the commission, pursuant to subsection e. of this section.

- e. The report submitted to the commission pursuant to subsection d. of this section shall include:
- (1) a list of all mosquito control and extermination activities performed during the year, including the location where the mosquito control activity took place and the method of mosquito control utilized;
- (2) a description of the source reduction methods used to control mosquito populations within the municipality during the previous year;
- (3) a description of the biological control methods used to control mosquito populations within the municipality during the previous year;
- (4) a description of the chemical control methods used to control mosquito populations within the municipality during the previous year;
- (5) data gathered during the previous year through the surveillance of mosquito populations and an explanation of how this surveillance information was used to determine the appropriate method of mosquito control to be used during mosquito control activities;
- (6) the approximate cost of each mosquito control activity carried out during the previous year; and
- (7) any other information that the commission determines necessary.
  - 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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#### **STATEMENT**

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This bill would require the State Mosquito Control Commission (commission) to establish a five year pilot program for mosquito control activities in any qualified municipality in the State. "qualified municipality" is defined in the bill as any municipality with a population under 10,000 in a county of the second class with a population between 300,000 and 330,000, according to the most recent federal decennial census. Any qualified municipality may elect to participate in the pilot program. The commission would provide oversight for mosquito control activities performed under the program. The bill provides that a municipality that participates in the pilot program would be required to: designate a member of the governing body to oversee mosquito control activities performed by the municipality; cooperate with the commission by providing information and performing services as requested by the commission; submit to the commission, annually, a plan for the work to exterminate mosquitos and eliminate their breeding places within the municipality, to be performed in the upcoming year with a detailed estimate of the moneys required for mosquito control

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6 7 activities; follow best management practices or other standards and guidelines for mosquito control activities in the State; and annually prepare and submit a report to the commission. The commission would be authorized, within the limits of monies appropriated for such purposes, to provide financial assistance to a participating qualified municipality for the implementation of its mosquito control plan developed under the program.

8 The report submitted to the commission under the bill would 9 include: a list of all mosquito control and extermination activities 10 performed during the year; a description of the source reduction 11 methods used to control mosquito populations within the 12 municipality during the previous year; a description of the biological and chemical control methods used during the previous 13 14 year; data gathered during the previous year through the 15 surveillance of mosquito populations and an explanation of how this 16 surveillance information was used to determine the appropriate method of mosquito control to be used during mosquito control 17 activities; the approximate cost of each mosquito control activity 18 19 during the previous year; and any other information that the 20 commission determines necessary.
