1 **AN ACT** concerning the submission of data on school buildings and grounds and amending P.L.2019, c.106.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.2019, c.106 (C.18A:41-7.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. <u>a.</u> Each board of education ¹of a school district, board of 9 trustees of a charter school or renaissance school project, 1 or chief 10 school administrator of a nonpublic school shall provide to local 11 12 law enforcement authorities **[**a copy of the current blueprints and maps critical incident mapping data for all schools and school 13 14 grounds ¹[within the school district or nonpublic school]¹. In the 15 case of a school building located in a municipality in which there is no municipal police department, [a copy of the blueprints and 16 maps critical incident mapping data shall be provided to an entity 17 18 designated by the Superintendent of State Police. A board of 19 education ¹of a school district, board of trustees of a charter school 20 or renaissance school project, or chief school administrator of a 21 nonpublic school shall provide revised [copies] mapping data to 22 the applicable law enforcement authorities or designated entities 23 any time that there is a change to the [blueprints or maps] critical 24 incident mapping data.
 - <u>b. Critical incident mapping data provided pursuant to</u> subsection a. of this section shall be:
 - (1) compatible with all platforms and applications used by local, State, and federal law enforcement authorities;
 - (2) provided in a printable format; and
- 30 (3) verified for accuracy through an annual walkthrough of school buildings and school grounds.
- 32 c. As used in this section, "critical incident mapping data"
 33 means information provided in electronic or digital form to assist
 34 first responders in an emergency including, but not limited to:
- 35 (1) aerial images of schools;
- 36 (2) floor plans, including room and suite numbers;
- 37 (3) building access points;
- 38 (4) locations of hazardous materials and utility shut-offs; and

d. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require local
law enforcement authorities or designated entities to access critical
incident mapping data using third party viewing software.

to the first full school year following the date of enactment.
Requires public schools and nonpublic schools to submit critical
