1 **AN ACT** concerning motor vehicle license plates and amending 2 R.S.39:3-33.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.39:3-33 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-33. The owner of an automobile which is driven on the 9 public highways of this State shall display not less than 12 inches 10 nor more than 48 inches from the ground in a horizontal position, and in such a way as not to swing, <sup>1</sup>[an identification mark or 11 marks] a registration plate or plates to be furnished by the 12 [division] commission; provided, that if two <sup>1</sup>[marks] registration 13 plates<sup>1</sup> are issued they shall be displayed on the front and rear of the 14 15 vehicle; and provided, further, that if only one <sup>1</sup>[mark] registration plate<sup>1</sup> is issued it shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle; and 16 provided, further, that the rear <sup>1</sup>[identification mark] registration 17 plate<sup>1</sup> may be displayed more than 48 inches from the ground on 18 19 tank trucks, trailers, and other commercial vehicles carrying inflammable liquids and on sanitation vehicles which are used to 20 21 collect, transport, and dispose of garbage, solid wastes, and refuse. 22 Motorcycles shall also display <sup>1</sup> an identification mark or marks <u>a</u> registration plate or plates<sup>1</sup>; provided, that if two <sup>1</sup>[marks] 23 registration plates<sup>1</sup> are issued they shall be displayed on the front 24 25 and rear of the motorcycle; and provided, further, that if only one <sup>1</sup>[mark] registration plate 1 is issued it shall be displayed on the rear 26 of the motorcycle. 27

The <sup>1</sup> [identification mark or marks] registration plate <sup>1</sup> shall contain the number of the registration certificate of the vehicle and shall be of such design and material as prescribed pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1989, c.202 (C.39:3-33.9). All <sup>1</sup> [identification marks] registration plates <sup>1</sup> shall be kept clear and distinct and free from grease, dust, or other blurring matter, so as to be plainly visible at all times of the day and night.

[No] A person [shall] '[may] shall not' drive a motor vehicle which has a '[license] registration' plate frame or '[identification marker]' holder that conceals or otherwise obscures '[any part of any marking] the name of the State or the registration number furnished by the commission' imprinted upon the vehicle's

registration plate, or any part of any insert which the [director] 1 <sup>1</sup>[chief administrator] commission <sup>1</sup>, as hereinafter provided, issues 2 3 to be inserted in and attached to that registration plate <sup>1</sup>[or 4 marker 1, or 1 any part of any temporary registration plate which 5 the chief administrator issues, provided that any part of any 6 marking imprinted upon the vehicle's registration plate or any part 7 of any insert which has been issued by chief administrator or any 8 part of any temporary registration plate issued by the chief 9 administrator is not concealed or obscured in a way that it cannot ] 10 that conceals or otherwise obscures the name of the State, the 11 registration number, or the expiration date on any temporary 12 registration certificate or temporary registration plate issued by the 13 commission. It shall not be a violation of this section and therefore 14 not a basis for a lawful stop if part of the name of the State or the 15 registration number imprinted on a vehicle's registration plate, or 16 part of an insert issued by the commission inserted in or attached to 17 the registration plate, or part of the name of the State, the 18 registration number, or the expiration date on a temporary 19 registration certificate or temporary registration plate is concealed 20 or otherwise obscured in a way such that the information to which 21 this provision applies can still reasonably be identified or discerned. <sup>1</sup>The Attorney General shall issue such guidance as the 22 23 Attorney General deems necessary for law enforcement officers to 24 properly interpret and enforce the provisions of this section. 25

The [director] chief administrator is authorized and empowered to issue registration plate inserts, to be inserted in and attached to the registration plates <sup>1</sup>[or markers] <sup>1</sup> described herein. They may be issued in the place of new registration plates <sup>1</sup>[or markers] <sup>1</sup>; and inscribed thereon, in numerals, shall be the year in which registration of the vehicle has been granted.

No person shall drive a motor vehicle the owner of which has not complied with the provisions of this subtitle concerning the proper registration and identification thereof, nor drive a motor vehicle which displays a fictitious number, or a number other than that designated for the motor vehicle in its registration certificate. During the period of time between the application for motor vehicle registration and the receipt of registration plates from the [division] commission, no person shall affix a plate <sup>1</sup>[or marker]<sup>1</sup> for the purpose of advertisement in the position on a motor vehicle normally reserved for the display of the registration plates required by this section if the plate <sup>1</sup>[or marker]<sup>1</sup> is designed with a combination of letters, numbers, colors, or words to resemble the registration plates required by this section.

A person convicted of displaying a fictitious number, as prohibited herein, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding

[\$500.00] \$500 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 60 days.
A person violating any other provision of this section shall be

A person violating any other provision of this section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding [\$100.00] \$100. In default of the payment thereof, there shall be imposed an imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding 10 days. A person convicted of a second offense of the same violation may be fined in double the amount herein prescribed for the first offense and may, in default of the payment thereof, be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding 20 days. These penalties shall not apply to the display of a fictitious number.
