- 1. a. There is established in, but not of, the Department of State the New Jersey Ireland Trade Commission. The commission shall consist of ¹[15] 23¹ members, to be appointed as follows:
- 10 ¹[Two] (1) (a) Four ¹ members of the Legislature shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, ¹[neither] two¹ of whom 11 shall ¹ [be members of the same political party] have current or past 12 13 involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs or shall have 14 interest in the well-being of trade relations between New Jersey and 15 <u>Ireland</u>¹; and two members of the Legislature shall be appointed by the ¹[Speaker of the General Assembly, neither of whom shall be 16 17 members of the same political party Minority Leader of the Senate, both of whom shall have current or past involvement in 18 19 organizations that promote Irish affairs or shall have interest in the 20 well-being of trade relations between New Jersey and Ireland.
 - (b) Four members of the Legislature shall be appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, two of whom shall have current or past involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs or shall have interest in the well-being of trade relations between New Jersey and Ireland; and two members of the Legislature shall be appointed by the Minority Leader of the General Assembly, both of whom shall have current or past involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs or shall have interest in the well-being of trade relations between New Jersey and Ireland.
 - (c)¹ The legislative members of the commission shall serve during the two-year legislative term in which the appointments are made.

- 1 Commerce, or its successor organization; and at least two public 2 members representing Irish American communities neither of whom 3 shall be members of the same political party.
- b. All appointments shall be made no later than 90 days following the day of enactment of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). A vacancy in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment was made.
 - c. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties, within the limit of funds appropriated to the commission or otherwise made available to it for its purposes.
 - d. The commission shall meet and hold hearings at the places it designates throughout the State.

The New Jersey Ireland Trade Commission shall be authorized to raise funds, through direct solicitation or other fundraising events, alone, or with other groups, and accept gifts, grants, and bequests from individuals, corporations, foundations, governmental agencies, and public and private organizations and institutions, to defray the commission's administrative expenses and to carry out its purposes as set forth in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The funds, gifts, grants, or bequests received pursuant to this section shall be deposited in an account in the Department of the Treasury and allocated and annually appropriated to the Department of State to defray the commission's administrative expenses and carry out its purposes.

5. This act shall take effect immediately.
