# ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION No. 173 **STATE OF NEW JERSEY** 220th LEGISLATURE

INTRODUCED JANUARY 23, 2023

#### **SYNOPSIS**

Urges Congress and President to reallocate certain funds from "Inflation Reduction Act of 2022" to increase active military basic pay.

### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



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1 AN ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION respectfully urging Congress and the President of the United States to reallocate funds from the 2 3 Internal Revenue Service to the Department of Defense to increase the pay of certain members of the Armed Forces serving 4 5 on active duty. 6 7 WHEREAS, The United States depends upon the members of its Armed Forces to ensure the safety and security of the nation; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Members of the United States Armed Forces dedicate 10 years of their lives to the service of this country, often being 11 separated from their families for extended periods, forgoing more 12 lucrative employment, and facing life-threatening dangers; and 13 WHEREAS, Basic pay for many active duty military members falls below \$15 an hour; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Approximately 23,000 active duty military members rely on food stamps, and some rely on other forms of public assistance; 16 and 17 WHEREAS, The United States Armed Forces face declining retention 18 and recruitment rates that make it difficult for the Armed Forces to 19 20 fulfill their core mission of protecting the nation; and WHEREAS, The federal "Inflation Reduction Act of 2022," Pub.L.117-21 22 169, allocated a total of approximately \$79.6 billion to the Internal 23 Revenue Service in addition to its existing budget; and 24 WHEREAS, The Internal Revenue Service plans to use much, if not all, 25 of this funding to increase its number of full-time employees by 26 nearly 87,000 within the next 10 years; and 27 WHEREAS, A study by the Transactional Records Access Clearinghouse at Syracuse University determined that in fiscal year 28 29 2021, the Internal Revenue Service audited taxpayers earning under 30 \$25,000 annually at five times the rate of other taxpayers; and 31 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives approved the "Family and Small Business Taxpayer Protection Act," H.B.23 of the 2023-2024 32 33 session, which rescinds funds allocated by the "Inflation Reduction 34 Act of 2022" to the Internal Revenue Service; and WHEREAS, The federal "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax Collectors Act 35 of 2023," H.B.161 of the 2023-2024 session, reallocates the 36 37 additional \$79.6 billion from the Internal Revenue Service to the Department of Defense to increase the pay of certain members of 38 39 the Armed Forces serving on active duty; and 40 WHEREAS, The primary purpose of the "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax Collectors Act of 2023" is to increase basic pay for active duty 41 military service members to a minimum of \$31,200 annual 42 43 compensation, equivalent to a \$15 hourly wage; and 44 WHEREAS, Increasing military basic pay will benefit more Americans 45 and New Jersey residents than increasing funding for the Internal 46 Revenue Service; and 47 WHEREAS, New Jersey is home to several military bases and many 48 active duty service members and their families; and

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1 WHEREAS, Increasing financial stability of active duty service 2 members is in the interest of the State; now, therefore, 3 4 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the General Assembly of the State of New 5 Jersey: 6 7 1. This House respectfully urges Congress and the President of the United States to enact the "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax 8 9 Collectors Act of 2023," H.R.161 of the 2023-2024 session, in 10 order to reallocate funds from the Internal Revenue Service to the 11 Department of Defense to increase the pay for certain members of 12 the Armed Forces serving on active duty. 13 14 2. Copies of this resolution, as filed with the Secretary of State, 15 shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the General Assembly to the President of the United States, the Majority and Minority Leaders of 16 17 the United States Senate, the Speaker and the Minority Leader of the United States House of Representatives, and each member of 18 Congress elected from this State. 19 20 21 22 **STATEMENT** 23 24 This resolution urges Congress and the President of the United 25 States to enact the "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax Collectors Act of 26 2023," H.R.161 of the 2023-2024 session, to reallocate funds from the Internal Revenue Service to the Department of Defense to 27 increase the pay of certain members of the Armed Forces serving on 28 29 active duty. 30 The Internal Revenue Service audits taxpayers earning under 31 \$25,000 annually at a rate five times taxpayers who earn a higher salary. The House of Representatives passed the "Family and Small 32 Business Taxpayer Protection Act," H.B.23 of the 2023-2024 33 session, which rescinds funds allocated by the "Inflation Reduction 34 35 Act of 2022," Pub.L.117-169, to the Internal Revenue Service. Instead, the "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax Collectors Act of 2023" 36 reallocates these funds to the Department of Defense for the 37 primary purpose of increasing basic pay for all active military 38 39 service members to at least \$31,200 annually, equivalent to a \$15 40 hourly wage. Currently, approximately 23,000 active duty service members 41 42 rely on food stamps in the United States, and some rely on other forms of public assistance. New Jersey is home to several military 43 44 bases, as well as many active duty military members and their 45 families. This resolution urges Congress and the President to move 46 47 forward with the enactment of the "Prioritizing Troops Over Tax Collectors Act of 2023" to alleviate financial difficulty for active 48
