P.L. 2023, Joint Resolution No. 3, *approved April 14, 2023* Senate Joint Resolution No. 106

A JOINT RESOLUTION designating April 14 of each year as 1 2 "Military Child Appreciation Day" in NJ and amending P.L. 3 2022, J.R.3. 4 WHEREAS, Members of the American military serve with honor and 5 distinction in defense of the freedoms and values which American 6 7 men and women enjoy every day; and 8 WHEREAS, Members of the American military share many of the 9 burdens that accompany military service with their family; and 10 WHEREAS, According to the Military Child Education Coalition, there 11 are approximately two million United States military children under the age of 18, 1.1 million of whom are school-aged; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Many military children have known only war since 14 September 11, 2001, including those military children whose 15 parents made the ultimate sacrifice of giving their lives in the 16 defense of the United States; and WHEREAS, Military children often have to adapt their lives to the 17 requirements of their parent's military obligations, and shoulder 18 19 responsibilities beyond their years; and 20 WHEREAS, In 1986, Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger established the month of April as the United States Department of 21 22 Defense's "Month of the Military Child" in an effort to increase 23 public knowledge and understanding of the issues surrounding 24 children who have a parent in the military; and 25 WHEREAS, Since 1986, there have been an increasing number of awareness campaigns aimed at recognizing the needs of military 26 children in all areas, such as coping with the deployment of a parent 27 28 to war zones; and 29 WHEREAS, Every April, the United States military services and 30 communities around the world recognize military children for their daily sacrifices and the challenges they must overcome; and 31 WHEREAS, New Jersey has recognized the sacrifices of military 32 children by joining the Interstate Compact on Educational 33 Opportunity for Military Children to remove barriers to educational 34 35 success imposed on the children of military families due to the 36 frequent moves and deployment of a parent; and 37 WHEREAS, In April 2022, New Jersey recognized April as "Military 38 Child Appreciation Month" and the last week of April as "Military 39 Child Appreciation Week"; and 40 WHEREAS, New Jersey will continue to take every opportunity to honor and recognize the brave men and women who serve their 41

This joint resolution shall take effect immediately. 30 31 32 **STATEMENT** 33 34 This joint resolution designates April 14 of each year as "Military Child Appreciation Day" in New Jersey. 35 Members of the American military serve honorably in defense of 36 37 the United States and the shared values of this nation. Such service 38 is accompanied by many burdens which are shared by military In 1986, Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger 39 families. 40 established the month of April as the "Month of the Military Child" 41 to highlight the trials that military children endure from having a 42 parent who serves in the Armed Forces, and the burdens they carry 43 in support of our nation. 44 Since 1986, the Department of Defense has commemorated April as the "Month of the Military Child," and implemented various 45 programs to aid military children and families. There has also been 46 47 an increasing number of awareness campaigns aimed at recognizing 48 the needs of military families, and New Jersey has already
