Requires DOT to implement complete streets policy that considers persons with certain disabilities.

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AN ACT concerning the Department of Transportation's
 implementation of a complete streets policy and supplementing
 Title 27 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

8 1. a. The Department of Transportation shall implement a 9 complete streets policy to plan, design, construct, maintain, and 10 operate new and rehabilitated public highways and public 11 transportation projects, as those terms are defined pursuant to 12 section 3 of P.L.1984, c.73 (C.27:1B-3), to provide safe access for 13 all users, including bicyclists, pedestrians, transit riders, individuals 14 with mobility impairments, and persons diagnosed with autism 15 spectrum disorder and persons with intellectual and developmental 16 disabilities. The complete streets policy shall require the 17 consideration and implementation of design elements and 18 infrastructure improvement projects that promote the ability of 19 persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder and persons with 20 intellectual and developmental disabilities to travel independently.

b. The department shall develop universal design concepts that 21 22 advance the mobility options for individuals with intellectual and 23 developmental disabilities, including and individuals diagnosed with 24 autism spectrum disorder, within the complete streets policy 25 established pursuant to subsection a. of this section. The 26 department shall develop guidance and policies for the means by 27 which the universal design concepts shall be incorporated into the 28 planning, design, construction, maintenance, and operation of new 29 and rehabilitated public highways and public transportation 30 projects, as those terms are defined pursuant to section 3 of 31 P.L.1984, c.73 (C.27:1B-3).

c. The department shall encourage regional and local entities
that apply for funding through the local aid program, pursuant to
section 25 of P.L.1984, c.73 (C.27:1B-25), to adopt a complete
streets policy that complies with the provisions of this section.

- 37 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
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STATEMENT

This bill requires the Department of Transportation (department) to implement a complete streets policy to plan, design, construct, maintain, and operate new and rehabilitated public highways and public transportation projects to provide safe access for all users, including bicyclists, pedestrians, transit riders, individuals with mobility impairments, and persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder and persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

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1 The complete streets policy is to require the consideration and 2 implementation of design elements and infrastructure improvement 3 projects that promote the ability of persons diagnosed with autism 4 spectrum disorder and persons with intellectual and developmental 5 disabilities to travel independently.

6 The bill also requires the department, as part of the complete 7 streets policy, to develop universal design concepts that advance the 8 mobility options for persons with intellectual and developmental 9 disabilities and individuals diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder. 10 The department is to develop guidance and policies for the means by 11 which the universal design concepts are to be incorporated into the 12 planning, design, construction, maintenance, and operation of new and 13 rehabilitated public highways and public transportation projects. 14 The department is required to encourage regional and local entities

that apply for funding through the local aid program to adopt acomplete streets policy consistent with the bill.
