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AN ACT concerning annual suicide prevention instruction for public
school teaching staff members and amending P.L.2005, c.310.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-112) is amended to8 read as follows:

9 2. <u>a.</u> The State Board of Education, in consultation with the New 10 Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory Council established in the 11 Department of Children and Families pursuant to P.L.2003, c.214 12 (C.30:9A-22 et seq.), shall, as part of the professional development 13 requirement established by the State board for public school teaching 14 staff members, require each public school teaching staff member to 15 complete at least two hours of instruction in suicide prevention, to be 16 provided by a licensed health care professional with training and 17 experience in mental health issues, in each professional development 18 The instruction in suicide prevention shall include period. 19 information on the relationship between the risk of suicide and 20 incidents of harassment, intimidation, and bullying and information on reducing the risk of suicide in students who are members of 21 22 communities identified as having members at high risk of suicide.

23 b. Not including teaching staff members subject to the 24 requirements of subsection a. of this section, a school employee or 25 an employee of a contracted service provider who has regular and 26 direct contact with students, as determined by the board of education, 27 shall complete a one-time training program in suicide prevention, 28 awareness, and response developed or identified by the Department 29 of Education pursuant to subsection c. of this section. A person 30 subject to the requirements of this subsection shall complete the required training program not less than 12 months from the date of 31 32 the development or identification by the department of training 33 programs and the development of the fact sheet or 12 months from 34 the person's date of hire, whichever occurs later.

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1 (2) develop an educational fact sheet on suicide prevention, awareness, and response. The educational fact sheet shall include, 2 3 but not be limited to, model guidance, best practices, and educational 4 resources that will assist school districts in developing their own 5 suicide prevention, awareness, and response protocols. Among the 6 best practices that districts are encouraged to consider in staff 7 training and in the development of school district protocols is the use 8 of table-top exercises where appropriate staff rehearse scenarios in 9 the event of a suicide impacting the school district. 10 The educational fact sheet shall be made available on the department's website and shall be distributed, at no charge, to all 11 12 school districts. The department shall update the educational fact 13 sheet on an annual basis in accordance with trends in the field of 14 youth suicide prevention. 15 d. Beginning in the first full school year following the date of 16 the development or identification by the department of the training 17 programs and the development of the educational fact sheet, and 18 annually thereafter, each school district and contracted service 19 provider shall provide to their employees who are subject to the 20 requirements of subsection a. or b. of this section, in a hard copy 21 paper form or in an electronic form: 22 (1) the educational fact sheet developed pursuant to paragraph (2) 23 of subsection c. of this section; and 24 (2) guidelines on the school district's reporting and suicide 25 prevention, awareness, and response protocols including, but not 26 limited to, contact information for each school's designated staff who 27 should be notified whenever an employee believes a student may be 28 at risk for suicide. 29 e. A school district shall provide information concerning its 30 compliance with the requirements of this section in the New Jersey 31 Quality Single Accountability Continuum Statement of Assurance 32 submitted by the district to the executive county superintendent of 33 schools. A contracted service provider shall annually provide a 34 statement of assurance to the school district concerning its compliance with the provisions of subsections b. and d. of this 35 36 section. 37 f. (1) No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or 38 damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the 39 implementation of the provisions of this section or resulting from any 40 training, or lack thereof, required by this section. 41 (2) The training, or lack thereof, required by the provisions of this 42 section shall not be construed to impose any specific duty of care. 43 (cf: P.L.2010, c.122, s.4) 44 45 2. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall remain 46 inoperative until the Department of Education has developed or 47 identified and made available to school districts the training

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programs and developed the educational fact sheet required pursuant 1 2 to subsection c. of section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-112). 3 4 5 **STATEMENT** 6 7 Under current law, public school teaching staff members receive 8 instruction in suicide prevention as part of their professional 9 development requirements. This bill provides that a school district 10 employee who is not subject to the current professional development requirement and an employee of a contracted service provider, who 11 12 have regular and direct contact with students as determined by the 13 board of education, will be required to complete a one-time training 14 program in suicide prevention, awareness, and response developed or 15 identified by the Department of Education. 16 The bill also directs the Department of Education, in consultation 17 with the Department of Children and Families, the Department of 18 Human Services, the New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory 19 Council, suicide prevention experts, and interested stakeholders in 20 the education community to: 1) develop or identify training programs 21 on suicide prevention, awareness, and response that persons subject 22 to the bill's training requirements may access and complete free of 23 charge; and 2) develop an educational fact sheet on suicide 24 prevention, awareness, and response. The educational fact sheet will 25 be made available on the department's website and distributed at no 26 charge to all school districts. 27 Under the bill's provisions, each school district and contracted 28 service provider is to annually provide to its employees the 29 educational fact sheet and guidelines on the school district's 30 reporting and suicide prevention, awareness, and response protocols, 31 including contact information for each school's designated staff who 32 should be notified whenever an employee believes a student may be 33 at risk for suicide.

The bill specifies that a person will not have a cause of action for any loss or damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the implementation of the bill's provisions.
