SYNOPSIS

Requires certain additional school district personnel to complete training program on suicide prevention.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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AN ACT concerning annual suicide prevention instruction for public
school teaching staff members and amending P.L.2005, c.310.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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> 1. Section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-112) is amended to read as follows:

9 2. <u>a.</u> The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 10 New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory Council established in the Department of Children and Families pursuant to P.L.2003, 11 12 c.214 (C.30:9A-22 et seq.), shall, as part of the professional 13 development requirement established by the State board for public 14 school teaching staff members, require each public school teaching 15 staff member to complete at least two hours of instruction in suicide prevention, to be provided by a licensed health care professional 16 17 with training and experience in mental health issues, in each 18 professional development period. The instruction in suicide 19 prevention shall include information on the relationship between the risk of suicide and incidents of harassment, intimidation, and 20 21 bullying and information on reducing the risk of suicide in students 22 who are members of communities identified as having members at 23 high risk of suicide.

24 b. Not including teaching staff members subject to the requirements of subsection a. of this section ¹and not including 25 licensed mental health care professionals¹, a school employee or an 26 27 employee of a contracted service provider who has regular and 28 direct contact with students, as determined by the board of 29 education, shall complete a one-time training program in suicide prevention, awareness, and response ²[developed or]² identified by 30 the Department of Education pursuant to subsection c. of this 31 32 section. A person subject to the requirements of this subsection 33 shall complete the required training program not less than 12 months from the date of the ¹[development or]¹ identification by 34 the department of training programs ¹[and the development of the 35 fact sheet]¹ or 12 months from the person's date of hire, whichever 36 37 occurs later. c. The Department of Education, in consultation with the 38 39 Department of Children and Families, the Department of Human Services, the New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Advisory 40 41 Council, suicide prevention experts, and interested stakeholders in 42 the education community, shall¹[:

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1 complete, free of charge, to fulfill the requirements. The 2 department may enter into an agreement with one or more private 3 entities to make a training program available, free of charge, to 4 persons subject to the requirements of subsection b. of this 5 section¹[; and 6 (2) develop an educational fact sheet on suicide prevention, 7 awareness, and response. The educational fact sheet shall include, but not be limited to, model guidance, best practices, and 8 9 educational resources that will assist school districts in developing 10 their own suicide prevention, awareness, and response protocols. 11 Among the best practices that districts are encouraged to consider in 12 staff training and in the development of school district protocols is the use of table-top exercises where appropriate staff rehearse 13 14 scenarios in the event of a suicide impacting the school district. 15 The educational fact sheet shall be made available on the 16 department's website and shall be distributed, at no charge, to all 17 school districts. The department shall update the educational fact 18 sheet on an annual basis in accordance with trends in the field of 19 youth suicide prevention]¹. ¹[Beginning in the first full school year] Not less than 12 20 d. following the date of the ¹[development or]¹ 21 months¹ 22 identification by the department of the training programs ¹[and the 23 development of the educational fact sheet,] or not less than 12 months from the person's date of hire,¹ and annually thereafter, 24 each school district and contracted service provider shall provide to 25 26 their employees who are subject to the requirements of subsection a. or b. of this section, in a hard copy paper form or in an electronic 27 28 <u>form</u> ¹[: 29 (1) the educational fact sheet developed pursuant to paragraph 30 (2) of subsection c. of this section; and (2) ¹guidelines on the school district's reporting and suicide 31 prevention, awareness, and response protocols including, but not 32 33 limited to, contact information for each school's designated staff 34 who should be notified whenever an employee believes a student 35 may be at risk for suicide. 36 e. A school district shall provide information concerning its 37 compliance with the requirements of this section in the New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum Statement of Assurance 38 39 submitted by the district to the executive county superintendent of 40 schools. A contracted service provider shall annually provide a 41 statement of assurance to the school district concerning its compliance with the provisions of subsections b. and d. of this 42 43 section. 44 f. ¹[(1) No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or 45 damage caused by any act or omission resulting from the 46 implementation of the provisions of this section or resulting from 47 any training, or lack thereof, required by this section.

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1 (2) The training, or lack thereof, required by the provisions of 2 this section shall not be construed to impose any specific duty of 3 care.] Each person who is required pursuant to subsection a. or 4 subsection b. of this section to complete a suicide prevention 5 training program shall have a duty to warn and protect when the 6 following conditions exist: 7 (1) a student has communicated to that person a clearly 8 identifiable threat of imminent, serious physical violence against 9 oneself and the circumstances are such that a reasonable person 10 would believe the student intended to carry out the threat; or 11 (2) the circumstances are such that a reasonable person would 12 believe the student intended to carry out an act of imminent, serious 13 physical violence against oneself. 14 A person acting in good faith and who takes reasonable steps to 15 discharge a duty to warn and protect shall be immune from civil and 16 criminal liability in regard to that disclosure.¹ 17 (cf: P.L.2010, c.122, s.4) 18 19 2. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall remain inoperative until the Department of Education has ¹[developed or]¹ 20 21 identified and made available to school districts the training 22 programs ¹[and developed the educational fact sheet]¹ required pursuant to subsection c. of section 2 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-23
