SYNOPSIS

Permits online purchase of eligible foods using WIC funds and use of WIC funds for grocery delivery charges.

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AN ACT concerning the New Jersey Special Supplemental Nutrition 1 2 Program for Women, Infants, and Children, and supplementing 3 Title 26 of the New Jersey Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. As used in this act: 9 ¹["Electronic benefits transfer" means a method that permits 10 electronic access to Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for 11 Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) food benefits using a card or 12 other access device approved by the Secretary of the United States 13 Department of Agriculture.]¹ 14 "Food instrument" means a voucher, check, electronic benefits 15 transfer card, coupon, or other document which is used by a 16 participant in the WIC program to obtain supplemental foods. ¹"WIC" means the federal Special Supplemental Nutrition 17 Program for Women, Infants, and Children, established pursuant to 18 the "Child Nutrition Act of 1966," Pub.L.89-642 (42 U.S.C. s.1771 19 20 et seq.).¹ 21 22 ¹[2. a. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 23 contrary, the Commissioner of Health shall implement an electronic 24 benefits transfer system in every county of the State for benefits 25 provided under the federal "Special Supplemental Nutrition 26 Program for Women, Infants, and Children" (WIC), established pursuant to the "Child Nutrition Act of 1966," Pub.L.89-642 (42 27 U.S.C. s.1771 et seq.), that meets all federal requirements and 28 29 specifications for such a system. 30 The Department of Health shall issue an electronic benefits b. 31 transfer card to all individuals receiving benefits under the WIC 32 program, which may be used to purchase WIC-eligible foods at an authorized New Jersey WIC vendor.]¹ 33 34 35 ¹[3.] <u>2.</u>¹ a. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, an individual who receives benefits under the WIC 36 37 program shall be permitted to: (1) purchase WIC-eligible foods using the online platform of an 38 authorized New Jersey WIC vendor, including an approved vendor 39 which operates predominantly as an online retailer; 2 and 2 40 (2) ²[expend a portion of the total value of the individual's WIC 41 42 check, cash value voucher or electronic benefits during a single 43 transaction, and carry forward any remaining fund balance for use during a future retail transaction; ¹[and,]¹ 44
