SYNOPSIS

Codifies and expands ARRIVE Together Pilot Program to make certain mental health services available to police responding to certain emergencies; appropriates \$2 million.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. a. As used in this section:
- "Pilot county" means a county in which a municipality has been selected by the "[Commissioner of Health] Attorney General" to participate in the pilot program "expansion" established pursuant to subsection c. of this section.
- "Pilot municipality" means a municipality selected by the

- "Pilot program ¹expansion ¹" means the ¹Crisis Response

 Support expansion of the Alternative Response to Reduce

 Program established by ¹subsection c. of this section.
- b. ¹[There is established a three-year Crisis Response Support 21 Pilot Program. The purpose of the 1 The Attorney General shall 22 establish a¹ pilot program ¹ [shall] to¹ be ¹known as the Alternative 23 Response to Reduce Instances of Violence and Escalation 24 (ARRIVE) Together Pilot Program. The program shall be designed 1 25 to provide ¹accessible crisis intervention, mental health screening, 26 or other support to police departments or forces in the State 27 when responding to a call that involves a person who is suffering 28 29 from a mental health condition or substance use disorder and is in] individuals experiencing mental health crisis who have contacted 30 or are engaging with law enforcement. 31
- Following the establishment of the program, the Attorney
 General shall effectuate a pilot program expansion as provided in
 subsection c. of this section¹.
- c. ¹ [The Commissioner of Health] Within the limits of available funds provided pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), the Attorney General shall select for participation in the pilot program ¹ expansion two municipalities in each of the northern, central, and southern regions of the State ¹ [, as follows:
- 41 (1) a northern regional pilot municipality shall be located in 42 Essex County in a municipality having a population of more than 43 30,000 and a population density of more than 10,000 persons per 44 square mile according to the latest federal decennial census;

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

(2) a central regional pilot municipality shall be located in Middlesex County in a municipality having a population of more than 35,000 and a population density of more than 7,500 persons per square mile according to the latest federal decennial census;

- (3) a southern regional pilot municipality shall be located in Burlington County in a municipality having a population of more than 7,000 and a population density of more than 4,750 persons per square mile according to the latest federal decennial census **1**, the selection of which shall not exclude participation by other counties or municipalities in the pilot program¹.
- d. The county prosecutor's office in each pilot county shall designate a crisis response support coordinator who shall be responsible for coordinating with the ¹[Commissioner of Health]

 Attorney General to develop procedures ¹[for implementing the Crisis Response Support Pilot Program in each pilot municipality]

 consistent with the guidelines established pursuant to subsection f. of this section 1.
 - e. ¹[Each pilot municipality or pilot county shall contract with a nonprofit] Consistent with the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection f. of this section, one or more¹ mental health service ¹[provider] providers shall be contracted¹ to provide ¹[support] services as needed¹ to the ¹State Police or the¹ police department or force¹, as appropriate,¹ in the pilot municipality when responding to a call that involves a person who is ¹[suffering from] experiencing¹ a mental health ¹[condition]¹ or substance use ¹[disorder and is in]¹ crisis. The provider shall ¹[be contracted to]¹ provide ¹[support] services as needed for up to¹ 24 hours a day, seven days a week. ¹[The pilot municipality or pilot county shall provide information concerning the mental health service provider to the appropriate county crisis response support coordinator.]¹
 - f. The [Commissioner of Health, in consultation with the county crisis response support coordinators,] Attorney General shall establish guidelines for the implementation of the pilot program ¹[in each pilot municipality] expansion ¹.
- ¹[The] To the extent applicable and consistent with the guidelines established pursuant to subsection f. of this section, the 1 governing body of a pilot municipality or pilot county shall provide documentation ¹ [of the costs incurred to implement the Crisis Response Support Pilot Program or information to the ¹[Commissioner of Health. The Department of Health shall reimburse each pilot municipality or pilot county for the documented costs associated with implementing the pilot program] Attorney General¹.
- h. The ¹[Commissioner of Health] Attorney General shall shall cause to be transmitted a report evaluating the

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implementation and operation of the pilot program ¹expansion ¹ to 1 the Governor and, pursuant to the provisions of section 2 of 2 3 P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature within 90 days after the completion of the pilot program ¹expansion ¹. The report 4 shall recommend whether the pilot program ¹expansion ¹ should be 5 continued, ¹[expanded] modified¹, or made permanent. 6 7 8 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 9 Department of '[Health] Law and Public Safety' the sum of \$2,000,000 to effectuate the provisions of section 1 of 10 11) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). P.L. c. (C. 12 The ¹ [Commissioner of Health] Attorney General and any other department, as appropriate, 1 may seek assistance from the federal 13 14 government, private foundations, and any other source to fund the ¹[Crisis Response Support] Pilot Program ¹expansion established 15 pursuant to section 1 of P.L. , c. 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3. This act shall take effect on the first day of the ¹[seventh] eleventh ¹ month next following the date of enactment and shall expire upon the filing of the report required pursuant to subsection h. of section 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The ¹[Commissioner of Health] Attorney General ¹ may take any anticipatory administrative action in advance of the effective date as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.
