## SYNOPSIS

Prohibits State Board of Education from requiring completion of performance-based assessment as condition of eligibility for certificate of eligibility with advanced standing.

## CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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AN ACT concerning performance-based assessments for teacher
candidates and supplementing chapter 26 of Title 18A of the
New Jersey Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 Notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the 1. a. 9 contrary, the State Board of Education shall not require a candidate for a certificate of eligibility with advanced standing <sup>1</sup>or a 10 certificate of eligibility<sup>1</sup> to complete a Commissioner of Education 11 approved performance-based assessment, including, but not limited 12 13 to, the edTPA, as a condition of eligibility for a certificate of 14 eligibility with advanced standing <sup>1</sup>or a certificate of eligibility. An 15 educator preparation program shall require candidates to complete a 16 performance-based assessment approved by the educator preparation program. The performance-based assessment approved 17 18 by the educator preparation program shall meet requirements set by the Commissioner of Education<sup>1</sup>. 19

20 b. <sup>1</sup>[An] <u>A certificate of eligibility with advanced standing</u><sup>1</sup> educator preparation program<sup>1</sup>, or a certificate of eligibility 21 educator preparation program,<sup>1</sup> shall not consider whether a 22 candidate has completed a Commissioner of Education approved 23 performance-based assessment when making a determination as to 24 whether to recommend a candidate for certificate of eligibility with 25 26 advanced standing certification <sup>1</sup>or certificate of eligibility certification<sup>1</sup> to the Commissioner of Education. 27

28 c. As used in this section <sup>1</sup>[, "certificate]:

<u>"Certificate of eligibility" means a certificate with lifetime</u>
validity issued by the State Board of Examiners to candidates who
<u>meet degree, academic, and applicable test requirements for teacher</u>
<u>certification.</u>

<u>"Certificate</u><sup>1</sup> of eligibility with advanced standing" means a
certificate with lifetime validity issued by the State Board of
Examiners to candidates who meet degree, academic, and test
requirements for teacher certification and complete an educator
preparation program.

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.
