Prohibits State Board of Education from requiring completion of performance-based assessment as condition of eligibility for certificate of eligibility with advanced standing or certificate of eligibility.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

Notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the 8 1. a. 9 contrary, the State Board of Education shall not require a candidate for a certificate of eligibility with advanced standing ¹ or a 10 certificate of eligibility¹ to complete a Commissioner of Education 11 approved performance-based assessment, including, but not limited 12 13 to, the edTPA, as a condition of eligibility for a certificate of 14 eligibility with advanced standing ¹or a certificate of eligibility. An educator preparation program ²[shall] may² require candidates to 15 complete a performance-based assessment approved by the educator 16 preparation program. The performance-based assessment approved 17 18 by the educator preparation program shall meet requirements set by 19 the ²[Commissioner of Education¹] commissioner approved professional education accreditation body of the educator 20 21 preparation program². b. ¹[An] <u>A certificate of eligibility with advanced standing</u>¹ 22

educator preparation program¹, or a certificate of eligibility 23 educator preparation program,¹ shall not consider whether a 24 candidate has completed a Commissioner of Education approved 25 performance-based assessment when making a determination as to 26 27 whether to recommend a candidate for certificate of eligibility with advanced standing certification ¹or certificate of eligibility 28 <u>certification</u>¹ to the Commissioner of Education. 29

As used in this section ¹[, "certificate]: 30 c.

"Certificate of eligibility" means ²[a] an instructional² 31 certificate with lifetime validity issued by the State Board of 32 Examiners to candidates who meet degree, academic, and 33 applicable test requirements for teacher certification. 34

"Certificate¹ of eligibility with advanced standing" means ²[a] 35 an instructional² certificate with lifetime validity issued by the State 36 Board of Examiners to candidates who meet degree, academic, and 37 38 test requirements for teacher certification and complete an educator 39 preparation program.
