Allows certain airports to carry over certain grant money into future years.

1 AN ACT concerning grant funding for certain airports and
2 supplementing P.L.1983, c.264 (C.6:1-89 et al.).

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. a. Any airport that has been awarded a grant provided through
8 the "Airport Safety Fund" established pursuant to section 4 of
9 P.L.1983, c.264 (C.6:1-92) or under the Department of
10 Transportation's Airport Improvement Program on or after January 1,
11 2019, may carry over grant money awarded from the Airport Safety
12 Fund or under the department's Airport Improvement Program into
13 future fiscal years, without the funds being rescinded by the
14 department, provided that:

15 (1) the airport has applied for any necessary municipal or county
16 approvals, or both, as applicable;

17 (2) the airport¹ submits to the department a schedule of the
18 expected expenditure of such money;

19 (3) the use of such money is authorized pursuant to the grant
20 agreement, the "New Jersey Airport Safety, Security and Improvement
21 Act," P.L.1983, c.264 (C.6:1-89 et al.), the Airport Improvement
22 Program, or, as applicable, a combination thereof; and

23 (4) any such carryover is not incompatible with federal aid or
24 assistance overseen by the department.

25 b. The Department of Transportation may promulgate rules and
26 regulations concerning the carryover of grant money pursuant to this
27 section.

29 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
