#### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes program for certain individuals to become certified as homemaker-home health aides and provide services to certain Medicaid enrollees.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Assembly Appropriations Committee on March 23, 2023, with amendments.

1 AN ACT concerning <sup>1</sup> [certified nursing assistants] homemaker-2 home health aides <sup>1</sup> and home care services and supplementing 3 P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.).

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. a. <sup>2</sup>As used in this section, "family member" means a child, parent, parent-in-law, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, spouse, domestic partner, or one partner in a civil union couple, or any other individual related by blood, and any other individual with a close association that is the equivalent of a family relationship.
- b.2 No later than nine months after the effective date of this act 13 and receipt of federal approval for the program, the Division of 14 Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of 15 16 Human Services shall establish a program under which a family member of an enrollee in Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare <sup>2</sup>[, or a third-17 party individual approved by the parent or guardian of an enrollee 18 in Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare, 2 may 2 seek to 2 be certified 2 by the 19 New Jersey Board of Nursing<sup>2</sup> as <sup>1</sup>[certified nursing assistant] a 20 homemaker-home health aide and, after receiving that 21 certification, may,2 under the direction of a registered nurse, 22 provide <sup>1</sup>[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-home health</u> 23 aide<sup>1</sup> services to the enrollee through a <sup>3</sup>[private duty nursing] 24 home care services<sup>3</sup> agency <sup>2</sup>[under the reimbursement rates 25 established pursuant to subsection d. of this section ] <sup>3</sup>[, home 26 health agency, or health care service firm<sup>2</sup>]<sup>3</sup>, provided that the 27 enrollee is under 21 years of age and <sup>2</sup>otherwise<sup>2</sup> qualifies <sup>2</sup>[for 28 private duty nursing 1 to receive those 2 services under Medicaid or 29 NJ FamilyCare. The division shall develop an assessment tool that 30 31 will allow the division to readily identify enrollees who meet these 32 eligibility criteria.
  - <sup>2</sup>[b.] <u>c.</u><sup>2</sup> The program established pursuant to this section shall require the family member <sup>2</sup>[or approved third-party individual]<sup>2</sup> to complete all the training, testing, and other qualification criteria as are required under State and federal law for certification as a <sup>1</sup>[certified nursing assistant] <u>homemaker-home health aide</u><sup>1</sup>. The <sup>3</sup>[private duty nursing] <u>home care</u><sup>3</sup> services agency <sup>3</sup>[<sup>2</sup>, home health agency, or health care service firm<sup>2</sup>]<sup>3</sup> that will employ the family member <sup>2</sup>[or approved third-party individual]<sup>2</sup> to provide <sup>2</sup>[private duty nursing] <u>homemaker-home health aide</u><sup>2</sup> services to the enrollee shall pay all costs for the family member <sup>2</sup>[or approved

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- <sup>2</sup>[c. The tasks delegated by a registered nurse to a family member who becomes certified as a <sup>1</sup>[certified nursing assistant] homemaker-home health aide <sup>1</sup> pursuant to this section shall be consistent with the tasks that may be generally delegated to <sup>1</sup>[certified nursing assistants] homemaker-home health aides <sup>1</sup> pursuant to the rules of the New Jersey Board of Nursing.
- d. ¹[Certified nursing assistant] Homemaker-home health aide¹ services provided by a family member of a Medicaid or NJ FamilyCare enrollee or an approved third-party individual who becomes certified as a ¹[certified nursing assistant] homemaker-home health aide¹ under the program established pursuant to this section shall be reimbursed to a private duty nursing agency at a rate of no less than \$30 per hour for such time as the enrollee is under 21 years of age.
- e.] d.² The Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services shall, no later than three years after the date the program is established pursuant to this section, prepare and submit a report to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature, concerning the viability of the program and the director's recommendations concerning the program.

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2. The Assistant Commissioner of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services <sup>2</sup>and the New Jersey Board of Nursing <sup>2</sup> shall <sup>2</sup>each <sup>2</sup> adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as are necessary to implement the provisions of this act.

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3. The Commissioner of Human Services shall apply for such State plan amendments or waivers as may be necessary to

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- 1 implement the provisions of this act and to secure federal financial
- 2 participation for State Medicaid expenditures under the federal
- 3 Medicaid program.
