22	This bill would make a supplemental appropriation for State	
23	Fiscal Year 2022 of \$800,000 to the Department of Health (DOH).	
24	The bill would direct the DOH to utilize the funds to implement the	
25	use of electronic benefit transfer (EBT) cards by persons	
26	participating in the Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program	
27	(SFMNP).	
28	The federally funded SFMNP helps provide locally grown	
29	unprepared fresh fruits, vegetables, and herbs to eligible seniors 60	
30	years of age or older. Qualified seniors receive five \$5 checks	
31	during the growing season to purchase locally grown fresh fruits	
32	and vegetables at participating roadside stands and community	
33	farmers markets across the State.
