BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

As used in this act, "civic event" means an event sponsored 9 by a government entity, ¹[the community] <u>a community-based</u> 10 <u>organization</u>¹, or a ¹[local]¹ nonprofit organization ¹[to address] 11 <u>that incorporates elements of service learning whereby students</u> 12 <u>learn and develop through organized service. A civic event shall</u> 13 <u>address</u>¹ an issue of public concern such as community health and 14 safety or environmental, economic, or community well-being.

16 Notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the 2. a. 17 contrary, a pupil of a public school in grades six through 12 who is absent from school to attend a civic event shall have one ¹State-18 19 excused¹ absence each school year for that purpose recorded as an excused absence on the pupil's attendance record or on that of any 20 21 group or class of which the pupil is a member 1 , provided that a 22 written notice signed by a parent or guardian of the pupil is 23 presented to the proper school authority pursuant to subsection b. of this section¹. A board of education may permit additional excused 24 Any transcript, application, 25 absences for such purposes. employment form, or any similar form on which information 26 27 concerning a pupil's attendance record is requested shall show, with 28 respect to absences, only absences other than excused absences 29 authorized pursuant to this subsection.

The parent or guardian of a pupil shall provide ¹ at least five 30 b. school days' notice] a signed written notice of an intended excused 31 absence to attend a civic event at least five school days¹ in advance 32 of the intended excused absence and such ¹other¹ documentation as 33 34 the superintendent or administrative principal of the school district 35 deems necessary to prove that the pupil meets the requirements for 36 an excused absence pursuant to subsection a. of this section. 37
