SYNOPSIS

Amends applicability of law prohibiting sale and distribution of plastic and paper carryout bags to food banks and food pantries.

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1 AN ACT concerning certain single-use and reusable carryout bags 2 and amending P.L.2020, c.117. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 3 of P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-99.128) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 3. a. Beginning 18 months after the effective date of P.L.2020, 10 c.117 (C.13:1E-99.126 et al.): 11 (1) no store or food service business shall provide or sell a 12 single-use plastic carryout bag to a customer; and (2) no grocery store shall provide or sell a single-use paper 13 14 carryout bag to a customer. 15 b. A municipality or county shall not adopt any rule, 16 regulation, code, or ordinance concerning the regulation or 17 prohibition of single-use plastic carryout bags or single-use paper carryout bags after the effective date of P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-18 99.126 et al.). 19 20 Beginning 18 months after the effective date of P.L.2020, c. c.117 (C.13:1E-99.126 et al.), this section shall supersede and 21 preempt any municipal or county rule, regulation, code, or 22 23 ordinance concerning the regulation or prohibition of single-use 24 plastic carryout bags or single-use paper carryout bags that was 25 enacted prior to the effective date of P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-26 99.126 et al.). 27 d. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection a. of this section to the contrary, beginning 24 months after the effective date of 28 29 P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-99.126 et al.), no food bank or food 30 pantry shall provide a single-use plastic carryout bag or single-use 31 paper carryout bag to a customer. 32 As used in this subsection: 33 "Food bank" means the same as the term is defined in section 2 of P.L.1982, c.178 (C.24:4A-2). 34 "Food pantry" means a nonprofit organization or government 35 entity that distributes food to individuals in need of assistance, 36 37 including, but not limited to, a soup kitchen, homeless shelter, or 38 religious organization. 39 (cf: P.L.2020, c.117, s.3) 40 41 2. Section 8 of P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-99.133) is amended to 42 read as follows: 43 8. No later than six months after the effective date of P.L.2020, 44 c.117 (C.13:1E-99.126 et al.): 45 a. the Department of State, in consultation with the Department of 46 Environmental Protection, shall establish a program to assist businesses in complying with the provisions of P.L.2020, c.117 47 EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.

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(C.13:1E-99.126 et al.), including, but not limited to, developing and
publishing on its Internet website guidance on compliance with the act,
and establishing an online clearinghouse of vendors who provide
environmentally sound alternatives to single-use plastic carryout bags,
single-use paper carryout bags, polystyrene foam food service
products, and single-use plastic straws; and

7 b. the organization under contract with the Department of 8 Environmental Protection pursuant to section 6 of P.L.2002, c.128 9 (C.13:1E-218) shall, in cooperation with local governments and the 10 business community, develop and implement a Statewide public information and education program concerning the provisions of 11 12 P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-99.126 et al.). The program shall include, 13 but need not be limited to, educational programs, public service 14 announcements, and the distribution of free reusable carryout bags 15 throughout the State. The program established pursuant to this 16 subsection shall include the distribution of 500,000 free reusable 17 carryout bags proportionally distributed to the State's food banks, as defined pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1982, c.178 (C.24:4A-2), based on 18 19 the population served by each food bank.

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3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

27 This bill would: (1) provide food banks and food pantries with a six month extension of the deadline set forth in section 3 of P.L.2020, 28 29 c.117 (C.13:1E-99.128), which prohibits stores and food service 30 businesses from selling or providing single-use plastic or paper 31 carryout bags to customers; and (2) require the Department of 32 Environmental Protection, as part of the Statewide public information 33 and education program it is required to conduct pursuant to section 8 34 of P.L.2020, c.117 (C.13:1E-99.133), to provide 500,000 free reusable 35 carryout bags to the State's food banks to be proportionally distributed 36 based on the population served by each food bank.

37 As used in the bill, "food bank" means the same as the term is 38 defined in section 2 of P.L.1982, c.178 (C.24:4A-2), i.e., "a nonprofit 39 food clearinghouse that solicits, stores, and distributes donations of 40 edible but unmarketable surplus food. The food is distributed to 41 nonprofit organizations that feed the needy." The bill defines "food 42 pantry" as "a nonprofit organization or government entity that 43 distributes food to individuals in need of assistance, including, but not 44 limited to, a soup kitchen, homeless shelter, or religious organization."
