**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.39:3-33 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-33. The owner of an automobile which is driven on the 9 public highways of this State shall display not less than 12 inches nor more than 48 inches from the ground in a horizontal position, and in 10 such a way as not to swing, <sup>2</sup>[an identification mark or marks] <u>a</u> 11 registration plate or plates<sup>2</sup> to be furnished by the [division] 12 commission; provided, that if two <sup>2</sup>[marks] registration plates<sup>2</sup> are 13 issued they shall be displayed on the front and rear of the vehicle; and 14 provided, further, that if only one <sup>2</sup>[mark] registration plate<sup>2</sup> is issued 15 it shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle; and provided, further, 16 that the rear <sup>2</sup>[identification mark] <u>registration plate</u><sup>2</sup> may be 17 displayed more than 48 inches from the ground on tank trucks, trailers, 18 19 and other commercial vehicles carrying inflammable liquids and on 20 sanitation vehicles which are used to collect, transport, and dispose of 21 garbage, solid wastes, and refuse. Motorcycles shall also display <sup>2</sup>[an identification mark or marks <u>a registration plate or plates</u><sup>2</sup>; provided, 22 that if two <sup>2</sup>[marks] registration plates<sup>2</sup> are issued they shall be 23 24 displayed on the front and rear of the motorcycle; and provided, further, that if only one <sup>2</sup> [mark] <u>registration plate</u><sup>2</sup> is issued it shall be 25 displayed on the rear of the motorcycle. 26

The <sup>2</sup>[identification mark or marks] <u>registration plate</u><sup>2</sup> shall contain the number of the registration certificate of the vehicle and shall be of such design and material as prescribed pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1989, c.202 (C.39:3-33.9). All <sup>2</sup>[identification marks] <u>registration plates</u><sup>2</sup> shall be kept clear and distinct and free from grease, dust, or other blurring matter, so as to be plainly visible at all times of the day and night.

[No] <u>A</u> person [shall] <sup>1</sup>[may] <u>shall not</u><sup>1</sup> drive a motor vehicle 34 which has a <sup>2</sup>[license] registration<sup>2</sup> plate frame or <sup>2</sup>[identification 35 marker]<sup>2</sup> holder that conceals or otherwise obscures <sup>1</sup>[any part of any 36 37 marking] the name of the State or <sup>2</sup>[any identification marks] the registration number<sup>2</sup> furnished by the commission <sup>2</sup> [pursuant to this 38 section which are  $1^{2}$  imprinted upon the vehicle's registration plate, or 39 any part of any insert which the [director] <sup>1</sup>[chief administrator] 40 commission<sup>1</sup>, as hereinafter provided, issues to be inserted in and 41 attached to that registration plate <sup>2</sup>[or marker]<sup>2</sup>, or <sup>1</sup>[any part of any 42 temporary registration plate which the chief administrator issues, 43 44 provided that any part of any marking imprinted upon the vehicle's

1 registration plate or any part of any insert which has been issued by 2 chief administrator or any part of any temporary registration plate 3 issued by the chief administrator is not concealed or obscured in a way 4 that it cannot] that conceals or otherwise obscures the name of the State, <sup>2</sup>[any identification marks] the registration number<sup>2</sup>, or the 5 6 expiration date on any temporary registration certificate or temporary 7 registration plate issued by the commission. It shall not be a violation 8 of this section <sup>2</sup> and therefore not a basis for a lawful stop <sup>2</sup> if  $\frac{2}{\text{part of}}^2$ the name of the State <sup>2</sup>[and any identification marks] or the 9 registration number imprinted<sup>2</sup> on a vehicle's registration plate<sup>2</sup>,<sup>2</sup> or 10 <sup>2</sup>part of an insert issued by the commission inserted in or attached to 11 the registration plate, or part of<sup>2</sup> the name of the State, <sup>2</sup>[any 12 identification marks, and] the registration number, or<sup>2</sup> the expiration 13 14 date on a temporary registration certificate or temporary registration plate <sup>2</sup> is concealed or otherwise obscured in a way such that the 15 information to which this provision applies<sup>2</sup> can<sup>1</sup> <sup>2</sup>still<sup>2</sup> reasonably be 16 identified or discerned. <sup>2</sup>The Attorney General shall issue such 17 18 guidance as the Attorney General deems necessary for law 19 enforcement officers to properly interpret and enforce the provisions 20 of this section.<sup>2</sup>

The [director] <u>chief administrator</u> is authorized and empowered to issue registration plate inserts, to be inserted in and attached to the registration plates <sup>2</sup>[or markers]<sup>2</sup> described herein. They may be issued in the place of new registration plates <sup>2</sup>[or markers]<sup>2</sup>; and inscribed thereon, in numerals, shall be the year in which registration of the vehicle has been granted.

27 No person shall drive a motor vehicle the owner of which has not 28 complied with the provisions of this subtitle concerning the proper 29 registration and identification thereof, nor drive a motor vehicle which displays a fictitious number, or a number other than that designated for 30 31 the motor vehicle in its registration certificate. During the period of 32 time between the application for motor vehicle registration and the receipt of registration plates from the [division] commission, no 33 person shall affix a plate <sup>2</sup>[or marker]<sup>2</sup> for the purpose of 34 35 advertisement in the position on a motor vehicle normally reserved for the display of the registration plates required by this section if the plate 36 37 <sup>2</sup>[or marker]<sup>2</sup> is designed with a combination of letters, numbers, colors, or words to resemble the registration plates required by this 38 39 section.

40 A person convicted of displaying a fictitious number, as prohibited 41 herein, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding [\$500.00] <u>\$500</u> or 42 imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 60 days.

A person violating any other provision of this section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding [\$100.00] <u>\$100</u>. In default of the payment thereof, there shall be imposed an imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding 10 days. A person convicted of a

second offense of the same violation may be fined in double the
amount herein prescribed for the first offense and may, in default of
the payment thereof, be punished by imprisonment in the county jail
for a period not exceeding 20 days. These penalties shall not apply to
the display of a fictitious number.
