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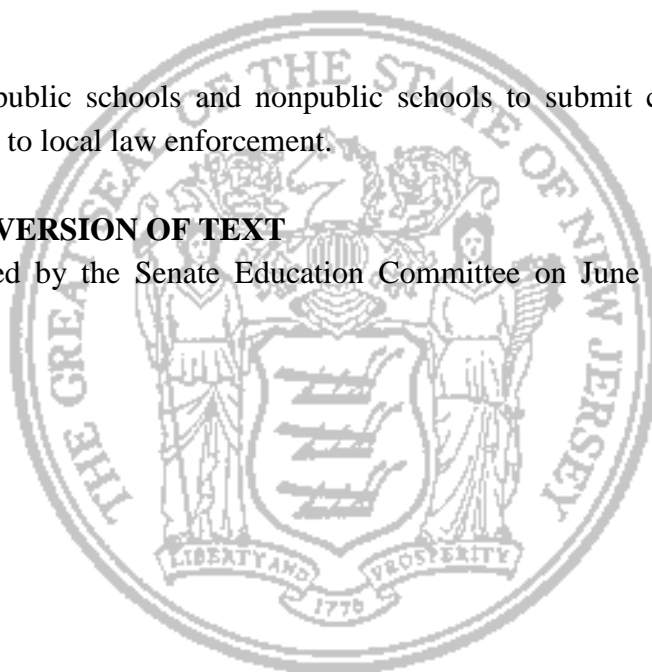

**SYNOPSIS**

Requires public schools and nonpublic schools to submit critical incident mapping data to local law enforcement.

1 AN ACT concerning the submission of data on school buildings and  
2 grounds and amending P.L.2019, c.106.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 1 of P.L.2019, c.106 (C.18A:41-7.1) is amended to  
8 read as follows:

9 1. a. Each board of education <sup>1</sup>of a school district, board of  
10 trustees of a charter school or renaissance school project,<sup>1</sup> or chief  
11 school administrator of a nonpublic school shall provide to local  
12 law enforcement authorities **【a copy of the current blueprints and**  
13 **maps】** critical incident mapping data for all schools and school  
14 grounds <sup>1</sup>**【within the school district or nonpublic school】**<sup>1</sup>. In the  
15 case of a school building located in a municipality in which there is  
16 no municipal police department, **【a copy of the blueprints and**  
17 **maps】** critical incident mapping data shall be provided to an entity  
18 designated by the Superintendent of State Police. A board of  
19 education <sup>1</sup>of a school district, board of trustees of a charter school  
20 or renaissance school project,<sup>1</sup> or chief school administrator of a  
21 nonpublic school shall provide revised **【copies】** mapping data to  
22 the applicable law enforcement authorities or designated entities  
23 any time that there is a change to the **【blueprints or maps】** critical  
24 incident mapping data.

25 b. Critical incident mapping data provided pursuant to  
26 subsection a. of this section shall be:

27 (1) compatible with all platforms and applications used by local,  
28 State, and federal law enforcement authorities;

29 (2) provided in a printable format; and

30 (3) verified for accuracy through an annual walkthrough of  
31 school buildings and school grounds.

32 c. As used in this section, “critical incident mapping data”  
33 means information provided in electronic or digital form to assist  
34 first responders in an emergency including, but not limited to:

35 (1) aerial images of schools;

36 (2) floor plans, including room and suite numbers;

37 (3) building access points;

38 (4) locations of hazardous materials and utility shut-offs; and

39 (5) any other relevant location information.

40 d. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require local  
41 law enforcement authorities or designated entities to access critical  
42 incident mapping data using third party viewing software.
