SYNOPSIS

Allows public schools to let certain students not enrolled in school participate in high school interscholastic athletics; allows public high schools in same district to enter into cooperative sports programs under certain conditions.

AN ACT concerning interscholastic sports programs and
 supplementing chapter 11 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
 Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association 9 shall allow public high schools in the same school district to enter 10 into a cooperative sports program for any sport at the varsity level, 11 regardless of the member schools' Group classification, if either of 12 the schools demonstrates an inability to field a team at the varsity 13 level due to: a decline in interest or participation in the sport at one 14 of the schools that impacts the ability of that school to safely field a 15 team; or budgetary constraints which force the elimination of 16 certain sports programs at one of the schools.

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18 2. a. A board of education may permit a student who attends a nonpublic school and who meets the eligibility requirements for 19 20 student athletes established by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association to try out for, and participate in, a school-21 22 sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad in the 23 student's district of residence in accordance with the same criteria 24 established for students enrolled in the district if the district is unable 25 to field a team or squad due to a decline in interest or participation in 26 the sport that impacts the ability of the district to safely field a team or 27 squad and the nonpublic school does not sponsor a high school 28 interscholastic sports team or squad in the sport in which the student 29 Any controversy concerning a student's wishes to participate. 30 compliance with the eligibility requirements for student-athletes 31 established by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association shall be adjudicated by the association in accordance with 32 33 its constitution and by-laws.

A student who attends a nonpublic school who wishes to compete on an interscholastic sports team or squad in his resident district shall:

(1) provide proof that he resides in the district; and

(2) meet the sports participation requirements established by the
school district for students enrolled in the district such as physical
examinations, insurance, age, academic, and other requirements. A
nonpublic school student shall comply with the same standards of
behavior, responsibilities, and performance as all other members of the
team or squad.

b. A student who withdraws from a school district to enroll in a
nonpublic school and who is ineligible to participate in interscholastic
athletics at the time of withdrawal from the school district due to his
failure to meet academic, behavioral, or eligibility standards, shall be
ineligible to compete in interscholastic athletic competition in

accordance with the rules of the New Jersey State Interscholastic
 Athletic Association.

3 c. A board of education may charge a student who participates in 4 a school-sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad 5 pursuant to this section, other than a student with financial hardship, a fee no greater than the actual cost per pupil of participating in the 6 7 sport. In determining financial hardship the criteria shall be the same 8 as the Statewide eligibility standards established by the State Board of 9 Education for free and reduced price meals under the State school 10 lunch program.

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12 3. a. A board of education may permit a student who receives 13 equivalent instruction elsewhere than at school pursuant to N.J.S.18A:38-25 and who meets the eligibility requirements for 14 15 student athletes established by the New Jersey State Interscholastic 16 Athletic Association to try out for, and participate in, a school-17 sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad in the 18 student's district of residence in accordance with the same criteria 19 established for students enrolled in the district if the district is unable 20 to field a team or squad due to a decline in interest or participation in 21 the sport that impacts the ability of the district to safely field a team or 22 squad. Any controversy concerning a student's compliance with the 23 eligibility requirements for student-athletes established by the New 24 Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association shall be adjudicated 25 by the association in accordance with its constitution and by-laws.

A student who receives such instruction who wishes to compete on an interscholastic sports team or squad in his resident district shall:

(1) provide proof that he resides in the district;

(2) meet the sports participation requirements established by the
school district for students enrolled in the district such as physical
examinations, insurance, age, academic, and other requirements. The
student shall comply with the same standards of behavior,
responsibilities, and performance as all other members of the team or
squad; and

35 (3) demonstrate to the board of education that he is receiving an
academically equivalent education compared to students enrolled in
the school district and that he is academically qualified to participate.

b. A student who withdraws from a public school to receive an
equivalent instructional program elsewhere than at school and who is
ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics at the time of
withdrawal from the public school due to his failure to meet academic,
behavioral, or eligibility standards, shall be ineligible to compete in
interscholastic athletic competition in accordance with the rules of the
New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association.

c. A board of education may charge a student who participates in
a school-sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad
pursuant to this section, other than a student with financial hardship, a
fee no greater than the actual cost per pupil of participating in the

sport. In determining financial hardship the criteria shall be the same
 as the Statewide eligibility standards established by the State Board of
 Education for free and reduced price meals under the State school
 lunch program.

d. The Department of Education shall develop guidelines for
school districts in making a determination in regard to the
demonstration required pursuant to paragraph (3) of subsection a. of
this section for only the purposes of eligibility to compete on an
interscholastic sports team or squad.

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11 4. a. A board of education may permit a student who attends a charter school and who meets the eligibility requirements for student 12 13 athletes established by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic 14 Association to try out for, and participate in, a school-sponsored high 15 school interscholastic athletics team or squad in the student's district 16 of residence in accordance with the same criteria established for 17 students enrolled in the district if the district is unable to field a team 18 or squad due to a decline in interest or participation in the sport that 19 impacts the ability of the district to safely field a team or squad and the 20 charter school does not sponsor a high school interscholastic sports 21 team or squad in the sport in which the student wishes to participate. 22 Any controversy concerning a student's compliance with the eligibility 23 requirements for student-athletes established by the New Jersey State 24 Interscholastic Athletic Association shall be adjudicated by the 25 association in accordance with its constitution and by-laws.

A student who attends a charter school who wishes to compete on an interscholastic sports team or squad in his resident district shall:

(1) provide proof that he resides in the district; and

(2) meet the sports participation requirements established by the
school district for students enrolled in the district such as physical
examinations, insurance, age, academic, and other requirements. A
charter school student shall comply with the same standards of
behavior, responsibilities, and performance as all other members of the
team or squad.

b. A student who withdraws from a school district to enroll in a charter school and who is ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics at the time of withdrawal from the school district due to his failure to meet academic, behavioral, or eligibility standards, shall be ineligible to compete in interscholastic athletic competition in accordance with the rules of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association.

c. A board of education may charge a student who participates in
a school-sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad
pursuant to this section, other than a student with financial hardship, a
fee no greater than the actual cost per pupil of participating in the
sport. In determining financial hardship the criteria shall be the same
as the Statewide eligibility standards established by the State Board of

Education for free and reduced price meals under the State school
 lunch program.

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4 5. a. A board of trustees of a charter school may permit a student 5 who attends a public school that is not a charter school, and who 6 resides in the charter school's district of residence, and who meets the 7 eligibility requirements for student athletes established by the New 8 Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association to try out for, and 9 participate in, a charter school-sponsored high school interscholastic 10 athletics team or squad in accordance with the same criteria 11 established for a student enrolled in the charter school if the charter 12 school is unable to field a team or squad due to a decline in interest or participation in the sport that impacts the ability of the charter school 13 14 to safely field a team or squad and the public school that is not a 15 charter school does not sponsor a high school interscholastic sports 16 team or squad in the sport in which the student wishes to participate. 17 Any controversy concerning a student's compliance with the eligibility 18 requirements for student-athletes established by the New Jersey State 19 Interscholastic Athletic Association shall be adjudicated by the 20 association in accordance with its constitution and by-laws.

A student who attends a public school that is not a charter school who wishes to compete on a charter school interscholastic sports team or squad shall:

(1) provide proof that he resides in the charter school district ofresidence; and

(2) meet the sports participation requirements established by the
charter school for students enrolled in the charter school such as
physical examinations, insurance, age, academic, and other
requirements. The student shall comply with the same standards of
behavior, responsibilities, and performance as all other members of the
team or squad.

b. A student who withdraws from a charter school to enroll in a public school that is not a charter school and who is ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics at the time of withdrawal from the charter school due to his failure to meet academic, behavioral, or eligibility standards, shall be ineligible to compete in interscholastic athletic competition in accordance with the rules of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association.

39 c. A board of trustees may charge a student who participates in a 40 school-sponsored high school interscholastic athletics team or squad 41 pursuant to this section, other than a student with financial hardship, a 42 fee no greater than the actual cost per pupil of participating in the 43 sport. In determining financial hardship the criteria shall be the same 44 as the Statewide eligibility standards established by the State Board of 45 Education for free and reduced price meals under the State school 46 lunch program.

6. a. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require a school district or charter school to provide transportation services or pay transportation costs associated with a student's participation in interscholastic athletics pursuant to the provisions of sections 2 through 5 of this act.

b. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require a school
district or charter school to change the schedules, procedures, or
participation requirements of an interscholastic sports team or squad to
accommodate a student who wishes to participate in interscholastic
athletics pursuant to the provisions of sections 2 through 5 of this act.

11 c. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit a school 12 district or charter school from permitting a student to participate in a school district-sponsored or charter school-sponsored high school 13 14 interscholastic athletics team or squad pursuant to the provisions of 15 this act for a reason other than that the school district or charter school 16 is unable to field a team or squad due to a decline in interest or 17 participation in the sport that impacts the ability to safely field a team 18 or squad.

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20 7. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after the date of21 enactment.

STATEMENT

26 This bill requires the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic 27 Association (NJSIAA) to allow public high schools in the same school 28 district to enter into a cooperative sports program for any sport at the 29 varsity level if either of the schools demonstrates an inability to field a 30 team at the varsity level due to: a decline in interest or participation in 31 the sport at one of the schools that impacts the ability of that school to 32 safely field a team; or budgetary constraints which force the 33 elimination of certain sports programs at one of the schools.

Under the current rules of the NJSIAA, schools are prohibited from entering into cooperative sports programs for basketball, baseball, softball and spring track, and in football if one of the schools is classified as a Group III school. This bill requires the NJSIAA to allow the schools to enter into cooperative sports programs regardless of the sport or the member schools' Group classification.

40 The bill also permits school districts to allow students who attend 41 nonpublic schools to try out for, and participate in, a high school 42 interscholastic athletics team or squad in the student's district of 43 residence if the district is unable to field a team due to a decline in 44 interest or participation in the sport that impacts the ability of the 45 district to safely field a team or squad, and if the nonpublic school 46 does not sponsor a high school interscholastic sports team or squad in 47 the sport in which the student wishes to participate. Comparable 48 provisions are included in the bill that will permit school districts to

1 also allow homeschooled students and charter school students to try 2 out for, and participate in, a high school interscholastic athletics team 3 or squad in the district. Public school students who may wish to 4 participate in a school-sponsored high school interscholastic athletics 5 team or squad at a charter school would also be permitted to do so, under similar criteria. School districts and charter schools are 6 7 permitted to charge students who participate in a school-sponsored 8 high school interscholastic athletics team or squad pursuant to this bill, 9 other than students with a financial hardship, a fee no greater than the 10 actual cost per pupil of participating in the sport.
