SYNOPSIS

Extends duration of law requiring certain provider subsidy payments for child care services be based on enrollment.

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1 AN ACT concerning child care subsidies and amending P.L.2021, 2 c.324. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 ¹1. The title of P.L.2021, c.324 is amended to read as follows: 7 8 AN ACT concerning State subsidies to child care providers, 9 supplementing Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, and making an appropriation.¹ 10 11 (cf: P.L.2021, c.324, Title) 12 ¹[1.] <u>2.</u>¹ Section 1 of P.L.2021, c.324 ¹(C.)¹ is amended to 13 14 read as follows: 15 1. a. For the period beginning on the effective date of P.L.2021, 16 c.324 and ending June 30, [2022] 2025, and notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and in addition to any other 17 18 criteria set forth by the Division of Family Development in the 19 Department of Human Services to determine a provider's subsidy 20 payment for child care services, the division shall determine the 21 subsidy payment for child care services issued to a licensed child 22 care center or a registered family day care provider based on the 23 number of children enrolled with the provider who are eligible for 24 child care services. At no time during this period shall a subsidy 25 payment for child care services issued to a licensed child care 26 center or a registered family day care provider be based on the 27 attendance of eligible children for child care services. 28 b. ${}^{1}(1){}^{1}$ A licensed child care center or a registered family day 29 care provider for which the subsidy payment is based on enrollment 30 of children who are eligible for child care services shall comply at 31 all times with requirements concerning the ratio of staff to enrolled 32 children, as established pursuant to regulation by the Office of Licensing in the Department of Children and Families. At no time 33 34 shall this ratio be based on the attendance of children eligible for 35 child care services. 36 ¹(2) A licensed child care center or a registered family day care 37 provider receiving an enrollment-based subsidy payment pursuant 38 to this section shall pay wages to its staff, and determine the number of hours worked by staff, based on the number of children 39 40 enrolled with the provider who are eligible for child care services. At no time shall the amount of wages paid to staff or the number of 41 42 hours worked by staff be based on the attendance of children eligible for child care services.¹ 43 ²(3) A licensed child care center or a registered family day care 44 provider receiving an enrollment-based subsidy payment pursuant 45

[Within 12 months following the effective date of this act, the 8 division shall conduct a study and submit a written report to the 9 Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-10 19.1), to the Legislature <u>The division shall conduct a study</u> comparing the costs of basing child care provider subsidy payments 11 12 on the number of children enrolled who are eligible for child care 13 services and basing such subsidy payments on the number of 14 children in attendance who are eligible for child care services.
