Adds 9-1-1 system regionalization costs to funds appropriated from "9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Trust Fund Account."

1 **AN ACT** concerning 9-1-1 system regionalization and amending P.L.2004, c.48.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 3 of P.L.2004, c.48 (C.52:17C-19) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. a. There is established in the Department of the Treasury within the General Fund a special account to be known as the "9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Trust Fund Account."
- 12 b. Funds credited to the "9-1-1 System and Emergency 13 Response Trust Fund Account" shall be annually appropriated for 14 the purposes of paying: (1) eligible costs pursuant to the provisions 15 of sections 13 and 14 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-13 and [52:17C-14] C.52:17C-14); (2) the costs of funding the State's capital 16 equipment (including debt service), facilities and operating 17 expenses that arise from emergency response; (3) the cost of 18 19 emergency response training, including any related costs or 20 expenses of the Office of Emergency Management in the Division 21 of State Police in the Department of Law and Public Safety; (4) the 22 cost of operating the Office of Emergency Telecommunications 23 Services created pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-24 3); (5) the cost of operating the Statewide Public Safety 25 Communications Commission created pursuant to section 5 of 26 P.L.2011, c.4 (C.52:17C-3.2); (6) any costs associated with implementing any requirement of the Federal Communications 27 Commission concerning 9-1-1 service that is not otherwise 28 29 allocated to a [carrier] telephone company and not eligible for 30 reimbursement under law or regulation; (7) any costs associated 31 with planning, designing, or implementing an automatic location 32 identification technology that is not otherwise allocated to a 33 wireless [carrier] telephone company and not eligible for reimbursement under law or regulation; [and] (8) any costs 34 35 associated with planning, designing, or acquiring replacement 36 equipment or systems (including debt service) related to the 37 enhanced 9-1-1 network as defined by subsection e. of section 1 of 38 P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-1); and (9) any costs associated with the 39 regionalization of the State's 9-1-1 system, including the expansion 40 of existing regional public safety answering points, as authorized in 41 section 7 of P.L.1989, c.3 (C.52:17C-7).
