BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. a. A school district¹, charter school, or renaissance school 8 9 project¹ that employs a school psychologist and offers in-person school psychology services to students in grades kindergarten 10 11 through 12, or any combination thereof, shall permit students to attend counseling sessions or meetings of any kind with the school 12 psychologist ¹for counseling purposes,¹ through virtual or remote 13 means¹, unless the school psychologist determines that in-person 14 counseling is in the best interest of the student¹. 15

b. Nothing in subsection a. of this section shall be construed to
prohibit any student from attending an in-person counseling session
or meeting with a school psychologist employed by the school
district¹, charter school, or renaissance school project¹.

c. As used in this section, "school psychologist" means a person
who holds a New Jersey standard educational services certificate
with a school psychologist endorsement.

24 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to25 the first full school year after the date of enactment.
