AN ACT establishing the "VETeach Pilot Program" in the
 Department of Education and supplementing chapter 6 of Title
 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. There is established in the Department of Education a 9 four-year "VETeach Pilot Program." The purpose of the pilot 10 program shall be to address the shortage of certified public school teachers, by taking advantage of the qualified workforce 11 12 represented by the State's veterans. The pilot program shall 13 facilitate the teacher certification of veterans in order to advance the State's goals of ensuring a qualified public school workforce and 14 15 addressing the high rate of unemployment among returning 16 veterans.

b. <sup>1</sup><u>A four-year public institution of higher education wishing to</u>
participate in the pilot program shall submit an application to the
<u>Commissioner of Education in a form prescribed by the</u>
<u>commissioner. The commissioner shall select up to four institutions</u>
to participate in the pilot program.

22 c.<sup>1</sup> Under the pilot program, <sup>1</sup>[Rowan University] <u>a</u> participating four-year public institution of higher education<sup>1</sup> shall 23 enroll, in a 36-month teacher preparation program, a single cohort 24 of students who are veterans of the United States Armed Forces and 25 26 who served on or after September 11, 2001. The program shall lead 27 to a baccalaureate degree and completion of the requirements 28 necessary to apply to the State Board of Examiners for a certificate 29 of eligibility with advanced standing.

30 <sup>1</sup>[c. Rowan University] <u>d. A participating four-year public</u> institution of higher education<sup>1</sup> shall establish, with the approval of 31 the State Board of Education, the coherent sequence of courses 32 required to be completed by a student under the pilot program in 33 34 order to be eligible to receive a certificate of eligibility with 35 advanced standing. A certificate of eligibility with advanced 36 standing issued to a student who completes the pilot program shall 37 authorize the student to seek employment as a teacher in grades 38 kindergarten through eight, and in certain secondary education 39 fields.

<sup>1</sup>[d.] <u>e.</u><sup>1</sup> Upon the conclusion of the pilot program, the commissioner shall report to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on the number of veterans who enrolled in the teacher preparation program established under the pilot program, the number of veterans who
