31	This bill appropriates \$200,000 to the Department of Law and
32	Public Safety (DLPS) for the Division of State Police Cyber Crimes
33	Unit to support the existing New Jersey Business Cyber Security
34	program.
35	Currently, the Cyber Crimes Unit provides training to civic,
36	business, and educational organizations regarding computers and
37	safety on the Internet. With the growing use of computers, the
38	Cyber Crimes Unit is conducting and assisting with significantly
39	more investigations where computers are being utilized for the
10	commission of fraud and identify theft. Additionally, many business
11	are the targets of malware, ransomware, phishing scams, website
12	spoofing, and overall hacking of their technology.
13	This bill will provide additional funding to the New Jersey State
14	Police Cyber Crimes Unit to advertise and administer this crucial
15	program.
