#### **SYNOPSIS**

Increases minimum monthly benefit under State SNAP Minimum Benefit Program from \$50 to \$95 and authorizes DHS to increase program benefit amount.

1	AN ACT concerning the State SNAP Minimum Benefit Program and
2	amending P.L.2022, c.32.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.2022, c.32 (C.44:10-111) is amended to read as follows:
- 9 1. a. There is established in the Division of Family Development 10 in the Department of Human Services the State SNAP Minimum 11 Benefit Program. Under the program, the division shall distribute to 12 each eligible household a monthly State SNAP benefit equal to the 13 difference between the household's federal SNAP monthly benefit and [\$50] \$95, which amount may be increased by the 14 Commissioner of Human Services, as deemed appropriate and 15 16 subject to available State appropriations. If federal funds become 17 available for the purposes of this subsection, the Commissioner of 18 Human Services shall utilize such federal funds as the primary source 19 for issuing the monthly State SNAP benefit before State funds, if necessary, are expended. The State SNAP benefit shall be provided 20 21 to an eligible household in addition to the federal SNAP benefit.
  - b. The program shall be subject to the same State rules and procedures for implementing the federal SNAP to the greatest extent possible, including, but not limited to, distributing the State SNAP benefit using the program's Electronic Benefit Transfer system and requiring that benefits be used solely for the purchase of food as defined in 7 U.S.C. s.2012.
  - c. The Commissioner of Human Services shall apply to the Food and Nutrition Service within the United States Department of Agriculture for any necessary waivers or approvals to implement the provisions of this section.
  - d. As used in this section:
  - "Eligible household" means a household that is certified to receive a federal SNAP benefit of at least one dollar per month, but less than [\$50] \$95 per month, or a larger amount as deemed appropriated by the Commissioner of Human Services, subject to available State and
- 37 <u>federal funds</u>.
- "SNAP" means the New Jersey Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
  Program, established pursuant to the federal "Food and Nutrition Act
  of 2008," Pub.L.110-246 (7 U.S.C. s.2011 et seq.).
- 41 (cf: P.L.2022, c.32, s.1)

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### S3491 RUIZ, CRUZ-PEREZ

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1	STATEMENT

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This bill increases the minimum monthly benefit under the State Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Minimum Benefit Program from \$50 to \$95 and authorizes the Commissioner of Human Services to increase the program's benefit amount. SNAP, formerly known as the Food Stamp Program, is a nutrition assistance program that serves as a safety net for low-income households.

9 Base SNAP benefits are provided by the federal government. 10 However, currently under the State SNAP Minimum Benefit 11 Program, State funds are used to ensure each SNAP household 12 receives a minimum monthly SNAP benefit of \$50. This bill amends 13 the governing law of this program to provide that the minimum 14 monthly SNAP benefit is \$95. Moreover, the bill authorizes the 15 Commissioner of Human Services to increase the State SNAP 16 Minimum Benefit Program benefit amount, subject to available State appropriations. The bill also clarifies that if federal funds become 17 available for the purposes of the State SNAP Minimum Benefit 18 19 Program, the Commissioner of Human Services is required to utilize 20 such federal funds as the primary source for issuing the monthly 21 benefit before State funds, if necessary, are expended.
