SYNOPSIS

Requires PANYNJ to post information in airports concerning services for victims of human trafficking.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

1 AN ACT concerning the provision of certain information at airports
2 of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey and
3 supplementing Title 32 of the Revised Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
6 *of New Jersey:*
7

8 1. Information concerning services for human trafficking
9 victims in Port Authority airports.

10 a. Any airport maintained or operated by the Port Authority
11 shall make available in plain view and in a conspicuous place and
12 manner in the public restrooms, informational cards and/or signs
13 developed by:

14 (1) the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance in
15 consultation with the New York State Interagency Task Force on
16 Human Trafficking; or

17 (2) the United States Department of Homeland Security.

18 b. All informational cards and signs shall only contain
19 information concerning services for human trafficking victims and
20 shall prominently include the national human trafficking hotline
21 telephone number.

23 2. This act shall take effect upon the enactment into law by the
24 State of New York of legislation having an identical effect, but if
25 the State of New York has already enacted such legislation, then
26 this act shall take effect immediately.
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29 STATEMENT

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31 This bill requires the Port Authority of New York and New
32 Jersey (Port Authority) to post information concerning the services
33 available to the victims of human trafficking.

34 Specifically, this information would be posted in a conspicuous
35 manner within the public restrooms of each airport operated by the
36 Port Authority. This information would be developed by the State
37 of New York's Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance or
38 the United States Department of Homeland Security.

39 This bill would not take effect until the State of New York has
40 enacted into law legislation having an identical effect.
