Section 1 of P.L.2021, c.194 (C.39:4-92.4) is amended to 8 9 read as follows: 1. a. As used in this section: 10 11 "Bicycle" shall have the same meaning as set forth in ¹[R.S.39:4-14.5] <u>section 2 of P.L.1975, c.328 (C.39:4-14.5)</u>¹. 12 13 ["Low-speed electric bicycle" shall have the same meaning as 14 set forth in R.S.39:1-1. 15 "Low-speed electric scooter" shall have the same meaning as set forth in R.S.39:1-1.] 16 17 "Pedestrian" shall include, but not be limited to, a pedestrian as defined in R.S.39:1-1[, a person in a wheelchair or motorized 18 wheelchair as defined in R.S.39:1-1, a person employed by or who 19 contracts with any public utility company in this State, a property 20 21 maintenance worker,] or any other person who is [permitted by law 22 to be] upon the roadway and outside of a motor vehicle for work, 23 emergency response, or recreation. 24 "Personal conveyance" shall include, but not be limited to, a 25 low-speed electric bicycle as defined in R.S.39:1-1, a low-speed electric scooter as defined in ¹[N.J.S.39:1-1] R.S.39:1-1¹, a manual 26 wheelchair, a motorized wheelchair as defined in ¹[N.J.S.39:1-1] 27 28 $R.S.39:1-1^{1}$ or a similar mobility assisting device used by persons 29 with physical disabilities or by persons whose ambulatory mobility 30 has been impaired by age or illness, an electric personal assistive 31 mobility device as defined in section 1 of P.L.2001, c.430 (C.39:4-32 14.10), a motorized scooter as defined in ¹[N.J.S.39:1-1] R.S.39:1-1¹, a skateboard as referenced in section 1 of P.L.1997, c.411 33 34 (C.39:4-10.5), a motorized skateboard as defined in ¹[N.J.S.39:1-1] R.S.39:1-1¹, roller skates as defined in section 1 of P.L.1997, c.411 35 (C.39:4-10.5), or any other device used by a person for 36 37 transportation. 38 b. The operator of a motor vehicle [approaching] shall <u>approach</u> a pedestrian 1 [,] <u>or</u> <u>a person operating a bicycle</u> [, low-39 speed electric bicycle, low-speed electric scooter,] or [any other 40 41 lawful] personal conveyance located or operating in an area 42 designated for pedestrians, bicycles, or [those] personal

conveyances [, as appropriate,] on the roadways of this State [shall
 approach] with due caution and [shall,] absent any other direction
 by a law enforcement officer, proceed as follows:

4 (1) when possible under existing safety and traffic conditions,
5 make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the pedestrian or the
6 person operating a bicycle or personal conveyance;

(2) if a lane change cannot be made pursuant to paragraph (1) of
this subsection, leave a reasonable and safe distance of not less than
four feet while approaching the pedestrian or <u>the person operating a</u>
<u>bicycle or</u> personal conveyance and maintain a distance of at least
four feet until the motor vehicle has safely passed the <u>pedestrian or</u>
<u>person operating the bicycle or personal</u> conveyance; or

(3) if it is ¹[not possible] <u>impossible</u>¹, prohibited by law, or 13 14 unsafe to make a lane change pursuant to paragraph (1) of this 15 subsection or to leave a reasonable and safe distance of not less than 16 four feet pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the motor 17 vehicle operator shall reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to 25 18 miles per hour or a lower posted speed and be prepared to stop; the 19 operator may pass the pedestrian or person operating a bicycle or 20 personal conveyance only if, considering the size and speed of the 21 motor vehicle, traffic conditions, weather, visibility, and the surface 22 and width of the roadway, passing does not endanger the safety of a 23 pedestrian, operator of the bicycle or personal conveyance, or any 24 other person on the roadway.

c. A person who commits a violation of the provisions of this
section which results in bodily injury as defined in N.J.S.2C:11-1
shall be fined \$500 and assessed two motor vehicle penalty points;
if no bodily injury results, the violator shall be fined \$100 and shall
not be assessed any penalty points.

d. Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude or
limit a prosecution or conviction for a violation of any offense
defined by the laws of this State or for any violation of Title 39 of
the Revised Statutes.
