SYNOPSIS

Removes registered apprenticeship program requisites of public work contractors; sets apprenticeship standards for prevailing wage projects.

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1 AN ACT removing apprenticeship program requirements for public 2 works projects, amending P.L.1963, c.150 and P.L.1999, c.238, 3 and repealing section 6 of P.L.2021, c.423. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. Section 8 of P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.32) is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 8. a. Contractors and subcontractors performing public work of a public body subject to the provisions of [this act] the "New 11 Jersey Prevailing Wage Act," P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 et 12 13 seq.) shall post the prevailing wage rates for each craft and 14 classification involved as determined by the commissioner, 15 including the effective date of any changes thereof, in prominent and easily accessible places at the site of the work or at such place 16 17 or places as are used by them to pay workmen their wages. 18 b. If a contractor or subcontractor participates in a registered 19 apprenticeship program, the contractor shall ensure that the 20 registered apprenticeship program requires the completion of the 21 on-the-job training hours which conform to the industry standards 22 for learning the skills of a specific craft or trade, as well as on-the-23 job organized, related instruction in technical subjects related to the 24 specific apprenticeable occupation in conformance with industry 25 standards. The industry standards for program completion shall be 26 based upon the training requirements as registered and certified by the United States Department of Labor for each individual 27 occupation and craft title published by the United States 28 29 Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration. 30 The classroom, on-the-job hours, and years of apprenticeship 31 required to meet the standards shall be equal to or greater than that 32 of the established apprenticeship programs for the craft that serves 33 as the basis for the prevailing wage determination. These 34 apprenticeship standards shall be detailed in the wage 35 determinations for each craft. 36 (cf: P.L.1963, c.150, s.8) 37 38 2. Section 3 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.50) is amended to 39 read as follows: 40 3. As used in chapter 11 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes: 41 ["Apprenticeship Agreement" means a written agreement, 42 complying with 29 C.F.R. s.29.7, between an apprentice and either 43 the apprentice's program sponsor, or an apprenticeship committee 44 acting as agent for a program sponsor, which contains the terms and 45 conditions of the employment and training of the apprentice.

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in **bold-faced brackets** [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined <u>thus</u> is new matter.

"Apprenticeship cohort" means the group of individual
 apprentices registered to a specific individual program during a
 one-year time frame, except that a cohort does not include the
 apprentices whose apprenticeship agreement has been cancelled
 during the probationary period.

6 "Apprenticeship committee" means those persons designated by
7 the sponsor to administer the program. A committee may be either
8 joint or non-joint, as follows:

9 (1) A joint committee is composed of an equal number of 10 representatives of the employer or employers and of the employees 11 represented by a bona fide collective bargaining agent or agents.

(2) A non-joint committee, which may also be known as a
unilateral or group non-joint committee, has employer
representatives, but does not have a bona fide collective bargaining
agent as a participant. A non-joint committee may include
employees.

17 "Apprenticeable occupation" means a skilled trade or technical
18 occupation that is included on the United States Department of
19 Labor's "List of Occupations Officially Recognized as
20 Apprenticeable by the Office of Apprenticeship".

"Apprenticeship program" means a plan containing all terms and
conditions for the qualification, recruitment, selection, employment,
and training of apprentices, as required under 29 C.F.R. ss.29 and
30, including such matters as the requirement for a written
apprenticeship agreement.]

26 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Labor and27 Workforce Development or his duly authorized representatives.

["Completion rate" means the percentage of an apprenticeship
cohort who receive a certificate of apprenticeship completion within
one year of the projected completion date.]

31 "Contractor" means a person, partnership, association, joint stock 32 company, trust, corporation, or other legal business entity or 33 successor thereof who enters into a contract which is subject to the 34 provisions of the "New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act," P.L.1963, 35 c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 et seq.), or who is required to pay its workers the prevailing wage by any other provision of law, and includes any 36 37 subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor of a contractor as defined 38 herein.

39 "Department" means the Department of Labor and Workforce40 Development.

41 "Director" means the Director of the Division of Wage and Hour
42 Compliance in the Department of Labor and Workforce
43 Development.

"Worker" includes laborer, mechanic, skilled or semi-skilled
laborer and apprentices or helpers employed by any contractor or
subcontractor and engaged in the performance of services directly
upon a public work, [who have completed or are actively

1 participating in a registered apprenticeship program,] regardless of 2 whether their work becomes a component part thereof, but does not 3 include material suppliers or their employees who do not perform 4 services at the job site. 5 ["Registered apprenticeship program" or "program" means an 6 apprenticeship program which is registered with and approved by 7 the United States Department of Labor, which provides each trainee with combined classroom and on-the-job training in an occupation 8 9 recognized as an apprenticeable occupation, and which involves the 10 attainment of manual, mechanical, or technical skills and 11 knowledge which, in accordance with the industry standard for the 12 specific apprenticeable occupation, are outlined under 29 C.F.R. 13 s.29.5. 14 "Sponsor" means any person, association, committee, or 15 organization operating an apprenticeship program and in whose 16 name the program is or will be registered or approved.] 17 (cf: P.L.2019, c.518, s.1) 18 19 3. Section 5 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.52) is amended to 20 read as follows: 21 5. a. A contractor shall register in writing with the department 22 on a form provided by the commissioner. The form shall require 23 the following information: 24 (1) The name, principal business address and telephone number 25 of the contractor; 26 (2) Whether the contractor is a corporation, partnership, sole 27 proprietorship, or other form of business entity; 28 (3) If the contractor's principal business address is not within the 29 State, the name and address of the contractor's custodian of records 30 and agent for service of process in this State; 31 (4) The name and address of each person with a financial 32 interest in the contractor and the percentage interest, except that if 33 the contractor is a publicly traded corporation, the contractor shall 34 supply the names and addresses of the corporation's officers; 35 (5) The contractor's tax identification number and unemployment insurance registration number; 36 37 (6) A certification form provided by the commissioner, with 38 documentation satisfactory to the commissioner, that the contractor 39 has all valid and effective licenses, registrations or certificates 40 required by State law, including registrations or certifications 41 required to do business in the State of New Jersey [, and the 42 contractor, if directly employing craftworkers, participates in a 43 registered apprenticeship program as defined in section 3 of 44 P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.50) for each craft they employ]; 45 (7) [A certification form provided by the commissioner, with 46 supporting documentation, establishing to the satisfaction of the 47 commissioner that the registered apprenticeship program, as defined

in section 3 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.50), meets all of the
 requirements of section 6 of P.L.2021, c.423 (C.34:11-56.55a), and
 29 C.F.R. ss.29.3, 29.4, 29.5, 29.6 and 29.7;

4 (a) If it is determined by the commissioner that a registered 5 apprenticeship program in which the contractor participates does 6 not meet all of the requirements of 29 C.F.R. ss.29.3, 29.4, 29.5, 7 29.6 and 29.7, that determination of the commissioner shall, subject 8 to the requirements of subsection b. of section 9 of P.L.1999, c.238 9 (C.34:11-56.56), including the contractor's right to request a 10 hearing, result in initial registration application denial, registration 11 renewal denial, revocation, or suspension of the certificate of 12 registration to perform public work in New Jersey;

(b) The determination of the commissioner under this paragraph
shall only impact the contractor's ability to obtain or maintain its
public works contractor registration certificate under P.L.1999,
c.238 (C.34:11-56.48 et seq.), and shall not affect the status of the
registered apprenticeship program for the purpose of its continued
operation in New Jersey;

19 (c) A determination by the commissioner under subparagraph (a) 20 of this paragraph (7) that a registered apprenticeship program in 21 which the contractor participates does not meet all of the 22 requirements of 29 C.F.R. ss. 29.3, 29.4, 29.5, 29.6 and 29.7 shall 23 result not only in initial registration application denial, registration 24 renewal denial, revocation or suspension of that contractor's 25 certificate of registration to perform public work in New Jersey, but 26 also shall result in the initial registration application denial, 27 registration renewal denial, revocation or suspension of every 28 contractor who is meeting the apprenticeship program participation 29 requirement through participation in the non-compliant registered apprenticeship program; provided that any initial registration 30 31 application denial, registration renewal denial, revocation or suspension shall be subject to the requirements of subsection b. of 32 33 section 9 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.56), including the 34 contractor's right to request a hearing] (Deleted by amendment, 35 P.L., c.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill); and

36 (8) Any other relevant and appropriate information as37 determined by the commissioner.

b. At the time of registration, and subsequently upon request,
the contractor shall submit to the commissioner documentation
demonstrating that the contractor has worker's compensation
insurance coverage for all workers as required by law.

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44 4. Section 9 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.56) is amended to 45 read as follows:

46 9. a. A contractor who: (1) willfully hinders or delays the
47 commissioner in the performance of his duties in the enforcement of
48 this act; (2) fails to make, keep, and preserve any records as

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1 required under the provisions of the "New Jersey Prevailing Wage 2 Act," P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 et seq.); (3) falsifies any such 3 record, or refuses to make any such record accessible to the 4 commissioner upon demand; (4) refuses to furnish a sworn 5 statement of such records or any other information required for the 6 enforcement of this act to the commissioner upon demand; (5) pays 7 or agrees to pay wages at a rate less than the rate prescribed by the 8 "New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act," P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 9 et seq.); (6) willfully makes, or causes to be made, a false, 10 deceptive or fraudulent statement on the public works contractor 11 registration form; or (7) otherwise violates any provision of this act, 12 shall be guilty of a disorderly persons offense and shall, upon 13 conviction, be subject to punishment by a fine of not less than 14 \$2,500 nor more than \$25,000 and disqualification from bidding on 15 or engaging in public work for a period of up to three years. 16 [Where the contractor has made or has caused to be made a false, 17 deceptive or fraudulent statement on the public works contractor 18 registration form in connection with the requirement of section 5 of 19 P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.52) that the contractor participate in a 20 registered apprenticeship program for each craft that the contractor 21 employs, and where the false, deceptive or fraudulent statement was 22 made by an officer or employee charged with the duty of 23 completion of the registration form for a contractor, that officer or 24 employee, upon conviction, shall be subject to punishment by the 25 fine indicated in this subsection or by imprisonment not exceeding 26 six months, or both.] 27 b. As an alternative to or in addition to sanctions provided by

the "New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act," P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 et seq.), the commissioner may, after providing the contractor with notice of any alleged violation of this act, and with an opportunity to request a hearing before the commissioner or his designee:

33 (1) Deny renewal, revoke or suspend the registration of a34 contractor for a period of not more than five years; or

35 (2) Require a contractor, as a condition of initial or continued 36 registration, to provide a surety bond payable to the State. The 37 surety bond shall be for the benefit of workers damaged by any 38 failure of a contractor to pay wages or benefits pursuant to or 39 otherwise comply with the provisions of the "New Jersey Prevailing 40 Wage Act," P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.25 et seq.) or this act. The 41 surety bond shall be in the amount and form that the commissioner 42 deems necessary for the protection of the contractor's workers, but 43 shall not exceed \$10,000 per worker. The surety bond shall be 44 issued by a surety that meets the requirements of N.J.S.2A:44-143. 45 The director may order the immediate suspension of a c.

45 c. The director may order the ininediate suspension of a
46 contractor's registration, prior to a formal hearing on the revocation
47 of the contractor's registration pursuant to subsection b. of this
48 section, if the director determines that ordering an immediate

1 suspension is in the public interest and provided that the contractor

2 is afforded an opportunity to contest the immediate suspension in3 the following manner:

4 (1) The director shall notify the contractor in writing of the 5 immediate revocation and the contractor's rights under the 6 subsection.

7 (2) The contractor may notify the director of its request for an
8 opportunity to be heard and contest the immediate suspension in
9 writing within 72 hours of its receipt of immediate suspension
10 notification.

(3) Within seven business days of receipt of the notification
from the contractor pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the
director shall grant the contractor a hearing to contest the immediate
suspension. The director shall permit the contractor to present
evidence at the hearing.

16 (4) The director shall issue a written decision within five 17 business days of the hearing either upholding or reversing the 18 contractor's immediate suspension. The decision shall include the 19 grounds for upholding or reversing the contractor's immediate 20 suspension.

(5) If the contractor disagrees with the written decision, the
contractor may appeal the decision to the commissioner, in
accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968,
c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.).

25 d. If the director intends to impose an immediate suspension as 26 set forth in subsection c. of this section, based upon a rebuttable 27 presumption as set forth in section 14 of P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.38), the director shall provide the contractor with a notice of 28 29 intent to suspend and the contractor may request a hearing before 30 the Director of the Division of Wage and Hour Compliance within 31 72 hours of the receipt of the notice of intent to suspend in order to 32 present evidence expeditiously in support of the position that the 33 suspension should not be imposed. The suspension shall not take 34 effect prior to the expiration of the 72-hour opportunity to request a 35 hearing. If such a request is not made, the suspension shall take 36 effect at the end of the 72-hour period. If such a request is made, 37 the suspension shall take effect only after the director conducts the 38 hearing.

39 e. If the director orders the immediate suspension of a 40 contractor's registration pursuant to subsection b. of this section, the 41 violation shall have no effect on the registration of any contractor or 42 subcontractor, regardless of tier, in the contractual chain with the 43 suspended contractor [, unless the registration form for the 44 contractual chain of contractors and subcontractors was filed by a 45 sponsor, in which case all of the contractors of whatever tier who participated in the sponsor's apprenticeship program shall be 46 47 suspended and their registrations shall be revoked by the 48 commissioner].

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| 9 | This bill amends the "New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act" by |
| 10 | setting a standard for apprenticeship programs if a contractor or |
| 11 | subcontractor chooses to participate in an apprenticeship program. |
| 12 | The bill revises "The Public Works Contractor Registration Act" |
| 13 | by removing the requirement that a contractor participate in a |
| 14 | registered apprenticeship program in order to be eligible for public |
| 15 | works projects. |

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
