1	A JOINT RESOLUTION designating the month of January of each year
2	as "Muslim Heritage Month" in the State of New Jersey.
3	
4	WHEREAS, The State of New Jersey takes great pride in the varied
5	religious and cultural traditions of residents of this State and seeks to
6	afford all people in New Jersey the opportunity to better understand,
7	recognize, and appreciate the rich histories, cultures, and shared
8	principles of Muslim Americans; and
9	WHEREAS, Muslims are the world's second largest religious group, with
10	1.9 billion adherents, representing approximately 25 percent of the
11	world's population; and
12	WHEREAS, Muslims have made significant contributions that shape our
13	world, including notable achievements in philosophy, mathematics,
14	astronomy, physics, chemistry, medicine, architecture, music,
15	literature, and the arts; and
16	WHEREAS, The 3.45 million Muslims in the United States come from
17	diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds, including immigrants and
18	native-born Americans, and represent approximately 1.1 percent of
19	the country's population; and
20	WHEREAS, The history of Muslims in the United States dates back to
21	before the country's founding, originating with enslaved Africans, of
22	whom scholars estimate as many as 30 percent were Muslim, who
23	brought Islamic beliefs and practices with them and contributed in
24	numerous ways to the founding of the nation, including courageous
25	and dedicated military service in every major war from the American
26	Revolutionary War until today; and
27	WHEREAS, Successive waves of Muslim immigrants from all over the
28	world have enriched American society; and
29	WHEREAS, Muslim Americans strive to promote peace and mutual
30	understanding between all faiths and identities, while upholding the
31	values and principles of Islam and those of the United States of
32	America; and
33	WHEREAS, There are nearly 300,000 Muslim Americans in New Jersey,
34	representing one of the largest Muslim American populations of any
35	state in the United States, including numerous current and former
36	elected officials dedicated to public service in their communities; and
37	WHEREAS, Incidents of anti-Muslim violence and rhetoric are still
38	prevalent in our State and educational initiatives are critical to
39	combatting bigotry; and
40	WHEREAS, The people of New Jersey benefit from the social
41	benevolence, patriotism, philanthropy, humanitarianism, advocacy,
42	civic engagement, culture, and business of Muslim Americans and
43	Muslim American organizations that operate within the State; and
44	WHEREAS, New Jersey recognizes the positive impact Muslims have
45	made, and continue to make, to the advancement of this State and the
46	nation, and believes it is appropriate to acknowledge and promote
47	awareness and appreciation of the invaluable contributions of

1	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
2	of New Jersey:

4	1. The month of January of each year is designated as "Muslim
5	Heritage Month" in the State of New Jersey.
6	The Governor is respectfully requested to issue a proclamation
7	each year calling upon the people of New Jersey, local government
8	agencies, and interested organizations to observe this month with
9	appropriate ceremonies, activities, and educational programs.

11	2. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.

16	This Joint Resolution designates the month of January of each year
17	as "Muslim Heritage Month" in the State of New Jersey. This
18	designation would allow the State and its residents to respectfully
19	acknowledge and promote awareness and appreciation of Muslim

21	Muslim community.
